1. Apologies and introductions

Meeting commenced at 6.35pm with Chair, Cr Anna Speedie, noting apologies.

2. General Business

2.1 Inland freight route

Discussion led by Cr Speedie highlighting the following:

- Inland freight drives our economies going forward.
- Safeguard against change to inland freight route.
- Keep high on the agenda.
- Lobby government to reaffirm combined council (ACSUM) position of inland freight and the high speed rail routes.

ACTION:

Cr Anna Speedie - ACSUM letters to The Hon Darren Chester MP, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport (Federal), Andrew Constance, Minister for Transport and Infrastructure (NSW), and The Hon Jacinta Allan, Minister for Public Transport, Minister for Major Projects (Victoria) indicating ACSUM support of the endorsed routes for the inland freight and high speed rail routes highlighting the economic and social importance of these routes to the ACSUM group of councils.

2.2 Lake Hume foreshore

Discussion around the Lake Hume Land and On Water Management Plan Community Reference Group, design of toilets at Lake Hume and the responsibility of Goulburn Murray Water around the toilets and provision of water to the toilets. Next meeting of reference group – Friday, August 5.

1. Raise the above issues on behalf of the ACSUM group of councils.
2. Distribute minutes of Lake Hume Land and On Water Management Plan Community Reference Group, August 5, to ACSUM members.

2.3 Inter shire planning agendas

Discussion took place around holistic planning as a region. Better sharing of information.

2.4 Mobile muster

Discussion led by Cr Speedie re possible collaboration between ACSUM registering for the mobile muster as a collective. Conversation was instigated from mobile muster awards at the 2016 National General Assembly of Local Government (NGALG) in Canberra. *Note: Cr Wilton advised that this is already being done through RAMROC.*

This led to discussion on current voting methods at the National General Assembly of Local Government conference.

ACTION:

Cr Henk van de Ven – Letter to Australian Local Government Association (ALGA) requesting the introduction of electronic voting to establish a quorum at the annual conference.

2.5 Border Rail Action Group – Passenger rail between Albury and Wodonga

Cr Speedie and Cr van de Ven briefed members on regular meetings being held between the Border Rail Action Group (BRAG), Wodonga, Albury, Benalla and Wangaratta councils, politicians and other relevant parties to talk about the condition of rail, rolling stock, planning, and economic and social impacts of the current rail service.

A report is currently being compiled by the aforementioned councils on lost opportunities and the commitment as a group to fund work which will inform the policy solution going forward.

At these meetings politicians are made aware of the issues so that they can continue to advocate on behalf of communities being impacted to provide an eventual solution to the problem with the aim being to shift the debate from the problems, to the solutions that are on the table.

ACTION:

Information will be duly circulated once report is done highlighting impact on, or action required (if any) by ACSUM.

2.6 Smart Cities plan

Cr Speedie and Cr van de Ven briefed members on the City of Wodonga and AlburyCity's joint submission to the Federal Government's Smart Cities Plan. Wodonga and Albury are asking for the opportunity to be a pilot or early rollout city, offering an opportunity to develop and demonstrate the practical application of the Smart Cities Plan in a cross border scenario. If successful, there would also be a spin off for the region.

2.7 Regional Capitals Australia

Cr van de Ven briefed members on the Regional Capitals Australia (RCA) group and the success the group has had in advocating at the federal government level. Purpose – to raise awareness of RCA and for the ACSUM group to spread the word to potential members.

Australia is home to 50 regional capitals. RCA membership currently includes 29 regional capitals.

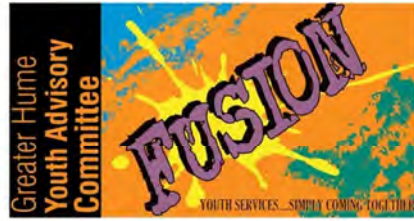
