2016 CUSTOMER SATISFACTION SURVEY RESULTS

In December 2015 Greater Hume Shire Council resolved to engage IRIS Research to conduct a comprehensive telephone based community survey.

Interviewing was carried out from 18 – 23 May 2016. Similar to the previous survey in 2012, to qualify for an interview, respondents had to have lived in Greater Hume for longer than 6 months and be aged 18 years or older. A total of 405 completed interviews were conducted, with a representative distribution across age, gender and wards.

Six in ten Greater Hume Shire residents (62.1% 2012:58.7%) are either satisfied (49.7%) or very satisfied (12.4%) with Council's overall performance, 30.4% neutral and 5.8% (2012: 6.6%) dissatisfied. This resulted in an overall mean satisfaction score of 3.68 (2012:3.59) out of 5, which is a medium level satisfaction rating.

NATURE / BUSH PLAYGROUPS AT GREATER HUME CHILDREN SERVICES

Can you remember making mudpies, climbing your first tree, jumping in puddles, catching frogs and bugs, having freedom to run and explore! At Greater Hume Children Services our nature/bush playgroups have taken place in a variety of natural settings and venues, we have held playgroup in a paddock at Gerogery, preparing the fire, making bread, cooking it and then eating it, yummy! The children learn many life skills including safety around fires, how to collect dry wood, the wind and weather, using flint to start a fire and counting to ten to wait for our food to cool down. We have been exploring and climbing up Nail Can Hill, Heathwood Park, Botanical Gardens at Albury and Old Stock Route, Henty. The children have built on their teamwork and perseverance skills. We have also had playgroup at a bush block in Jindera, where children are exposed to using real tools, ropes and a variety of loose parts, mud, dirt and stones etc. Our educators and families are also benefitting from being out in nature. They have learnt how to use limited natural resources from the environment and bush, going on walks, whatever the weather, getting their gumboots on and jumping in puddles and role modelling whilst at the same time having fun. Nature/Bush playgroups encourage children to explore, ask questions, risk take, problem solve, create, imagine, challenge themselves, team build, improves behaviour, social relationships, it provides them with knowledge on native animals, plants and trees, grow respect for the world around them.

Empty containers must be correctly cleaned both inside and out and allowed to drain or air dry to ensure they contain no rinse water. All containers delivered will be inspected to ensure they meet the Agsafe container cleanliness standards. *Containers containing chemical residue will not be accepted.* Clean containers collected by drumMUSTER are shredded or crushed and the materials used for recycling into materials such as irrigation piping and garden furniture. The drumMUSTER scheme is funded by a levy on crop protection and animal health products sold in rigid steel and plastic non-returnable chemical containers.

From jars to pallets

In 1981 Jill Davis arrived from Britain to Australia in a drought with husband, two young children - setting up to farm rice near Tocumwal. The family expanded with the arrival of their third child. Soon after, Jill and nearby friends started making tomato relish to use up the masses of left over tomatoes after harvest.

What follows is nothing short of a fabulous story of how just a single kitchen condiment becomes an all Australian successful business.

Early in our discussion Jill says "it was simple really, I just took the opportunity when it arose, and I have done that since every day".

From humble beginnings, supplying just one coffee shop, Jill and her husband Robin have created a highly nimble business focusing on producing just Jill's Cuisine Traditional Tomato Relish which is now supplied to all Coles Supermarkets in Australia, and privately owned supermarkets and shops.

Jill says that initially in the early days she sought permission of the council to manufacture the relish in her kitchen, selling six jars at a time to her friend's coffee shop and other small shops. Then Jill approached the supermarket in Deniliquin who placed an order for five dozen asking her "have you got five dozen?" Jill laughs recalling that on that day she whizzed home, cooked the five dozen, and then whizzed them back to the store.

Hooked from this point Jill says "the dye was cast". Next Robin built her a free standing commercial kitchen.

Around this time the family moved to Jindera and Council permitted her to build a small factory at her home in Jindera. By now Jill's market had expanded to 38 shops across Victoria.

Jill describes the trigger for the next growth phase. One day while conducting a tasting in an Albury delicatessen, a customer came into the deli and had a taste, looked at the price and made the statement "you should supply Coles Supermarkets", to which Jill nearly fainted!!

Plucking up her courage, Jill rang Coles with the thought "they can only say no" and with luck again was able to speak to the buyer for Victoria who invited her to Melbourne. When the buyer asked how many stores she would like to supply into "because I've got 500", Jill's reply was "Albury", and landed a deal to initially supply nine stores.

The rest is history, today Jill's Cuisine Traditional Tomato Relish is now sold in all Coles Australian supermarkets. These days her relish heads out from Jindera by the pallet load.

Born out of a desire to save waste, the relish is made from locally grown produce and is free from any artificial preservatives, colours and flavours.

Jill is still making her Traditional Tomato Relish herself and doing business with her loyal customers, retailers big and small.

HENTY TOWNSHIP TO REVIEW ITS BUSH FIRE PREPARATION

Henty Township is to undertake a review of its preparedness if it should come under attack from a large bush fire. Over the last few years a number of fires have threatened the interface areas of Henty and many people had no idea what they should do. Planning is the key to being prepared.

The Rural Fire Service is assisting Henty to undertake this review by preparing a Community Protection Plan for the township. The plan includes 3 maps that aim to improve community and fire fighter capacity to prepare for and survive bush fires. It is important for residents to know and understand what level of threat their property may be under if a bush fire were to impact the township of Henty. This threat could come from direct flame impact, from radiant heat or ember attack and a map will show where these levels of threat are predicted for the township. Knowing your level of threat will then assist you and your family to make decisions about what you should do if the township is threatened by a bush fire.

Property preparation is a very important aspect of survival in a bush fire and what you do around your own home or property is vital. The Community Protection Plan also produces a map that identifies works that are to be undertaken by land managers in the area. These include the Council, National Parks, Crown Lands and the Local Lands Services. These organisations all have land they manage that borders the township of Henty, or they are responsible for aspects of mitigation for the township.

An Operational Brigade Map is also produced in the process; this identifies at risk assets and residents in the community. This map assists fire fighters to plan, prepare and combat bushfires.

A community meeting will be held on Thursday 20 October at the Henty Bowling Community Club between 6-7 pm. Come along to find out more about how to increase your safety in the event of bush fire and have some input into the Henty Community Protection Plans.

The Pet Registry is an online database of microchipped and registered cats and dogs that live in NSW. The register has been developed to return lost pets to their owners and to promote responsible pet ownership in the community. If you have registered your cat or dog and it goes missing, the microchip can be scanned by an authorised person so your pet can be safely returned to you. Owners are encouraged to create an online profile and claim their existing pets and to register ownership of any new cats and dogs. Online access to the register will give you access to update your contact details, report your pet missing and change the owner of pets. To get your pet microchipped, or find out the microchip number, please take your pet to your local vet.

LIFETIME PROTECTION FOR YOUR PET - OCT 2016

Is your dog or cat registered for life?

During October Greater Hume Shire Council is offering residents the chance to check registration and microchip your companion animals. See below for details on Microchipping Days. To make a booking, you have to pay a reduced fee of \$20 at one of Council's Offices or Customer Service Centres. Alternatively, the Local Vets are also offering \$20 microchipping for October only. Under the Companion Animals Act, owners of dogs and cats must:

- Microchip their dog or cat by 3 months of age, or before it is sold or given away,
- Lifetime register their cat or dog with the local council before it is 6 months old,
- Ensure their dog is under effective control,
- Pick up their dog faeces from public areas,
- Address barking problems,
- Ensure their dog wears a collar and identification tag when in a public place,
- Prevent their dog or cat from causing harm to any person or other animal.

Council's Rangers will be visiting properties throughout the Shire to update the NSW Companion Animal Register. Failure to register your pet may result in an Infringement Notice being issued for \$275.

FIREWOOD (FALLEN TIMBER) COLLECTION

The collection of fallen timber within Greater Hume Shire (not including Hume Freeway, Olympic and Riverina Highways) with a low or medium conservation status (see map, obtained from Greater Hume Shire Council) requires a Permit to Collect Fallen Timber (Firewood) from a Public Road. The cost of the permit is \$30 and is valid for 12 months from the date of purchase.

MAJOR EVENTS September to November 1916 (source: Australian War Memorial)

18 November 1916 - Somme campaign ended. Australian troops endured trench warfare in a severe winter on the Western Front.

LOCAL HISTORY

Here is an extract from Three Shires and Their Council's, Chapter 2, Meeting the Challenges of the Great War, author Mr Bruce Pennay, October 2006. "To some it seemed that the Germans within the community were to blame for the lack of success. After the 1916 referendum the Member for Wagga Wagga had taunted JJ Cusack, an anti-conscriptionist, in the parliament: Cusack 'smooches to every German in his electorate'. In January 1917 a Wagga Wagga and a Henty newspaper ran an interview with EA Carruthers, a Walla Walla bank manager. Carruthers was alleged to have said that there had been secret meetings in Walla Walla to keep down the rate of recruitment. He referred to Walla as 'Berlin' and a 'hotbed of disloyalty'. A public meeting in Walla Walla protested against what it saw as a provocative insult. Paech was voted to the chair of the meeting and clashed with WG Balfour who tried to act as a meeting spoiler. Paech was plainly upset at disfranchisement. He made known his disappointment that the Prime Minister, Hughes, could have said that there would be no Germans in the Australian forces, because they might shoot the Australians in the back. The meeting declared that Walla Walla 'was not ashamed of its honor roll or of our efforts made in collections for patriotic purposes' and ended with a splendid display of loyalty with the singing of the National Anthem and three cheers for the King. Still, a week before the referendum, voters were reminded of the dangers that could lurk within it. Walla Walla newsagent, Hans When, a registered alien, was arrested and charged with having a double-barrelled, breech-loading gun. With undoubted relief, the police found he had no camera, which would have been another breach of the prohibition regulations applicable to aliens.

Road Safety

SLOW DOWN IN WET WEATHER & AVOID FLOODED ROADS

Drivers need to adjust their behaviour, to avoid the increased risk of crashes in wet weather, drive to the conditions and slow down. For safe braking, allow extra distance to the vehicle in front. Driving on roads during or after a flood is extremely hazardous. Roads may be damaged, bridges destroyed and communities may be isolated by flood waters.

When driving through flood affected areas **YOU MUST:**

- Obey road closures and check road conditions
- Not drive into water of unknown depth and current
- Use a recommended route and do not hurry
- Stay away from waterways and storm water drains

WORKS PROGRAM FOR SPRING

Due to the recent weather conditions a number of road closures were put in place, and a number of gravel and sealed roads were damaged. Council will endeavour to repair these roads in the coming weeks.

Road works on Holbrook Jingelic Road (MR 331) have been completed, road widening, installation of guard rail & lowering of the crest has made a big impact on traffic through the area. Road widening through the cutting on Fairburn Road will continue in the coming weeks when weather conditions are more favourable. The road works at the southern end of Balldale Walbundrie Road is yet to have a primer seal, once again weather conditions are hindering progress.

A number of major road works are programmed for this financial year, some of these include:

- Howlong Kywong Road (MR 370) 5km of pavement widening (Courtney Lane -Corowa Boundary).
- Coach Road construction – 1.5km section, southern end from existing seal.
- Wymah Road construction – from the end of seal to the Wymah Recreation Ground.
- Henty Pleasant Hills Road widening – Area near Henty Ryan Road.
- Back Walbundrie Rand Road – Repair of a number of sections.
- Culcairn Cemetery Road reconstruction.

Roadside slashing and spraying will commence again in the coming months when weather conditions are more suitable.

HLN invites you to join an information session on Ovine Hoof Health. Discussion will include identification, management and treatment options for sheep lameness, abscess and footrot. LANDFILL/WASTE TRANSFER STATION PRICES 2015/2016

COVER YOUR LOAD - Residents are reminded to cover your load on the way to the landfill or transfer station. This ensures all your rubbish gets to the waste centre and may prevent you from receiving a fine.

ILLEGAL DUMPING - Illegal dumping of rubbish in Greater Hume Shire can be a problem from time to time. Council relies on residents to help identify where rubbish has been dumped. Illegal dumping is an offence and offenders will be prosecuted.

ITEMS OF WASTE

The list below provides details of some wastes and what can be done with them:

Asbestos	Only accepted at Culcairn Landfill.
Batteries (Car & Truck)	Accepted free for recycling at all waste centres.
Cardboard & Paper	Must be uncontaminated. Accepted at Culcairn, Holbrook and Jindera waste facilities (3 cubic metre skips). Also in smaller (domestic) quantities at Burrumbuttock and Gerogery transfer stations.
Chemical Drums	Council runs two (2) Drummuster collections per year (usually May and October) at Burrumbuttock, Culcairn and Henry waste facilities, Holbrook Shire Depot and the Walbundrie showgrounds.
Computers & TV's (e-waste)	Must be separated from general waste. Council is providing free drop off at all our shire facilities to enable the collection and recycling of Computers and TV's.
Green Waste	Must not be contaminated. Green waste consist of prunings, cut up trees and shrubs <u>only</u> . Separate areas are provided at waste centres for green waste disposal.
Mobile Phones (e-waste)	Must be separated from general waste. Recycling boxes are located in all Council service centres (Culcairn, Henry, Holbrook, Jindera and Walla Walla).
Waste Oil	Accepted <u>free</u> for recycling at Burrumbuttock, Culcairn, Gerogery, Holbrook and Jindera waste centres. Southern Oil contractors also provide a <u>free</u> on farm/business collection service contact 0438 661 401.
Prohibited Substances	Council, at least bi-annually, provides a Household Hazardous Chemical Collection day. Hazardous materials (which cannot be disposed of at landfills and transfer stations) include paints and varnishes, thinners, strippers, acids, arsenic and mercury, pesticides, fungicides and herbicides, out of date medicines to name a few.
Scrap Metal	<u>Must</u> be separated and deposited on the area set aside at each waste facility. All scrap metal is recycled.
Tyres	<u>Must</u> be separated from general waste. Tyres are accepted at Culcairn, Holbrook and Jindera waste centres.
