Council does not accept hazardous wastes, chemical drums (except as arranged on drum muster days) or animal carcasses.

Asbestos is NOT accepted. Council has adopted a policy to address the potentially serious health hazard posed during the demolition or removal of asbestos material. The policy applies to all developments and renovations involving asbestos via the implementation of conditions of development consent and enforcement where necessary within Greater Hume Shire. Waste Oil Collection

Some years ago Council participated in a regional collection process of waste oil through Riverina Regional Organisation of Councils (RROC). All three former councils established oil recycling facilities at some of their landfills and transfer stations funded through the Product Stewardship for Oil Transitional Assistance Grants or similar programs.

Oil Recycling Facilities are currently located at:

Burrumbuttock Transfer Station - Culcairn Landfill - Gerogery Transfer Station - Holbrook Landfill - Jindera Transfer Station.

This service via RROC has been provided by Southern Oil Refining Pty Ltd or Southern Oil. Southern Oil has given Council an undertaking that in addition to servicing the 5 Council collection points, they will collect from the farms or businesses (subject to a minimum quantity). This will be a significant improvement for farms and businesses which have difficulty in transporting and disposing of the oil to one of Council's waste facilities. With over 2000 rural properties and many businesses within the townships producing waste oils, a better organised and programmed collection service will ensure the majority of waste oil is recycled within the Shire. This service is FREE. No charge is made for collection of oil from farms and businesses or when disposed of at one of Council's Waste Facilities above.

e-waste ■ e-recycling

What is e-waste?

E-waste is any broken, obsolete or unused electrical appliance including personal computers, printers, televisions, VCRs, DVDs, stereos, game consoles, telephones, fax machines, phones, stereos, cabling, microwaves and irons.

Where is the e-waste going?

Two million computers are sent to landfill in Australia every year, with another 7 million sitting in the back of cupboards and garages. The average person will dispose of approximately 3.3 tonnes of electronic waste in their life-time. Electronic waste can contain toxic materials that are hazardous, difficult to dispose of and can be very environmentally damaging.

Why is e-waste a problem?

Electronic waste is made from a huge range of component materials that are useless for further manufacturers until the product is dismantled and component materials are separated – often a very difficult and costly process. Many of the materials that make up electronic waste are valuable, such as gold and platinum. If these materials are extracted they can be reused in the manufacturing process again as a secondary raw material.

Where can e-waste be recycled in Greater Hume Shire?

Council will initially provide bins at the Culcairn Landfill, Jindera Waste Transfer Station and the Holbrook Landfill to encourage recycling of e-waste. Residents will be required to pay for the use of e-waste recycling facilities.
