



HERE'S HOW THE RACE IS RUN: For this event you require your fastest pet dog and a friend. One person (person A) will hold the dog at one end of a marked race track while the other person (person B) backs away from the dog until they are standing on the finish line. Person B can call the dog as they walk away and can even have doggy treats, all in the name of enticing the dog, once the starter's flag drops, to quickly race towards person B. The first dog across the finish line wins. Heats may be held, depending on the number of entrants. Dogs causing interference during a heat or final with other dogs will be eliminated.

THE RULES OFF DOGGY DASH

- Dogs, of any breed may enter .All dogs must be registered
- Races will be in 2 classes 7kg and under. 7-15kg Weight of dogs will be based on trust however if challenged a dog may be weighed before starting the race. Total number of dogs in each group no more than 30.
- Each race will be a knock out. First 3 winners into next round until final.
- Maximum number of dogs per race will be 15.
- Dogs must be vaccinated (proof of vaccination is not required for entry however should any dispute arise it will be required)
- No bitches on heat & No aggressive dogs, aggressive dogs will be disqualified and fee not refunded
- Dogs must have 2 handlers: Only two handlers in the race area per dog: one at start (releaser) and one at finish line (catcher).
- Entrant and Entry must meet all Race Conditions. Entry and/or Entrant not meeting the Conditions will be disqualified and prize(s) will be forfeited.
- The race will occur at the Henty Showground.
- Dog check-in begins at 9.30am All registered dogs must check-in no later than 15 minutes before their first heat.
- The three qualifying heats will be contested consecutively. The top three (3)finishers from each heat will advance to the Final.
- Henty Show is not responsible for any injury caused to the entrant's dog or to themselves during their time at the showground.
- Dog treats are allowed.
- All dogs must be on a leash (no extendable leads) outside of the racing area and will be asked to leave (without refund) if unruly.
- Owners are required to clean up their dog's faeces.
- No dogs that are not involved in the race are permitted in the racing area.
- Neither of the handlers may cross over into the race area after the race has begun.
- The releaser must keep the dog's front feet behind the starting line, and all 4 feet must be on the ground at the start of the race. Dogs cannot be push started over the starting line. If these rules are not adhered to, the dog will be disqualified.
- The catcher must keep their body behind the second line (the line furthest from the start.) Their arms may be extended, but they cannot touch the dog until the dog has crossed the first line (the line closest to the start). The catcher may have one (1) toy or object to attract the dog, but the object may not cross over into the race area. No laser lights. If these rules are not adhered to, the dog will be disqualified.
- Dogs do not have to stay in their own lanes.
- Dogs must reach the finish line themselves and not be pushed or pulled across.
- In all cases, the decisions of the officials and management are final.







All bulls over the age of 12 months must have a nose ring or an approved nose clasp, whilst on parade and in the Judging Ring be led by such ring or nose clasp. All cattle in Breed section must be registered or have been progeny registered with the respective Breed Society to which they belong. If in the opinion of the Stewards, any exhibit/s be deemed to be dangerous or diseased, the owner of such exhibit/s, upon notice to that effect, must remove such exhibit/s from the show society's ground. If called upon by the committee of Stewards, exhibitors must make statutory declarations that their exhibits conform to the conditions under this the prizes for which they compete are offered.
- 4. The Henty Show Society will not be held responsible for the loss of any animal/bird during transportation to & from the showgrounds.
- 5. No Stallion will be allowed to compete other than in stallion classes, or where specified.
- 6. ENTRIES (in writing) will close at the Secretary's Office on Friday prior to the show, unless stated otherwise and must be accompanied by a signed Waiver Form.
- All exhibitors must place their exhibits in the space allowed to them by the Committee of Management or Stewards. All Exhibits must be in place on the ground by 8am ready for judging. Unless otherwise stated.



- For large flowers, use "champagne" bottles eg: Bearded Iris, Shrubs & Arum Lillies.
- Present the rose/flower facing the judge, held in the bottle with a strip of paper/foil inside the neck of the bottle it acts as a plug and holds the rose in place.
- Please put your name on the bottom of your containers, vases & bottles.
- Present your containers of roses with most of the blooms to the front, facing the judge.





SUBJECT DEFINITIONS:

LANDSCAPE / WATERSCAPE: A picture of natural scenery which may include trees, people or other subjects, providing that these elements do not dominate the picture.

ANIMAL / BIRD: A picture of living animals or birds, either confined or in their natural environment, preferably showing no evidence of the hand of man.

PEOPLE STUDY: Study of a person or persons, ranging from head studies to full length, with or without accessories. Ideally it should show some aspect of the character or personality of the subject, and can be engaged in some activity where the emphasis is on the person.

OPEN: Any subject treated pictorially. A pictorial treatment is one embodying the element of good design, arrangement or composition and which reflects the personal interpretation of the photographer.

MACRO / CLOSE-UP: Macro / Close-up is photography of small objects including subjects like spiders, bugs and flowers, or any small object or part there-of.

ACTION: A still photograph that shows someone or something in motion. The image needs to be taken in a way that makes the subject look like it's still moving.

BLACK & WHITE / MONOCHROME: A photograph or image developed or executed in black and white or in varying tones of only **one** colour.

ENLARGEMENT: A picture of 150mm x 250mm (8" x 10") or larger, enlarged by printer, darkroom or commercial means.

ALL CLASSES are judged on the image being relevant to the topic. The subject should be easily identifiable as the main topic of the photograph. Images that contain "Nature and Natural Environments" as the theme are only able to be enhanced by computer and are not to be computer generated.

HOW to ENTER entries in SECTION "Z" for the HENTY SHOW

General: Enquiries:

Follow ALL conditions as set out in the schedule, otherwise entries may not be accepted.

All entries must be identified with the entrant's name and address/phone number. An entry form must accompany the entries, with all entries written on the form to correspond with entries handed in. If there is more than one entry in a class, the class need only be written once but followed by the number of entries. (Eg: Z-5-Open x 9).

A disclaimer form must accompany the entry form.

All entry forms must have the entrant's name, address and signature on them. Any out of town or non local entrants perhaps should include their **phone number** also.

The Judge works on only what is presented, don't assume they know what you mean or are trying to portray, therefore it is a good idea to give each entry a title. This also adds to the impact.

As an option and to assist yourself down the track, mark on the reverse of each entry the year and place it was entered. (Eg: Cul 08, Henty 09). Memories should not be relied on.

Prints:

'Collection of six' prints to be on one mount, not framed.

Ensure the presented print goes in the correct section for it's size and subject. Normal lab/mini lab prints (called mini prints in competition circles) are acceptable in categories #1 and #10. These are 15cm x 10cm or 6inch x 4 inch.

Larger size prints have their own class. See conditions.

Prints can be placed on the mounts any way which is pleasing to the eye. Mostly they are placed concentric. Adhere firmly to the mount, especially if the print is large. Put extra mounting material in the middle of the print to stop it buckling. Images present better if mounted on sturdy backing material.

Plastic over the prints may protect the print but lessens the impact of the subject. Titles should be neat, central and unobtrusive, usually under the print, leaving a slightly wider margin on the frame at the bottom.
