It also serves as a reminder for us to clean up around the house, the sheds and get the fire plan organised.

The Burrum Brigade recently received a “new to us” truck to replace one of our ageing tankers. The new 1 Alpha boasts crew safety features as well as a host of other features. 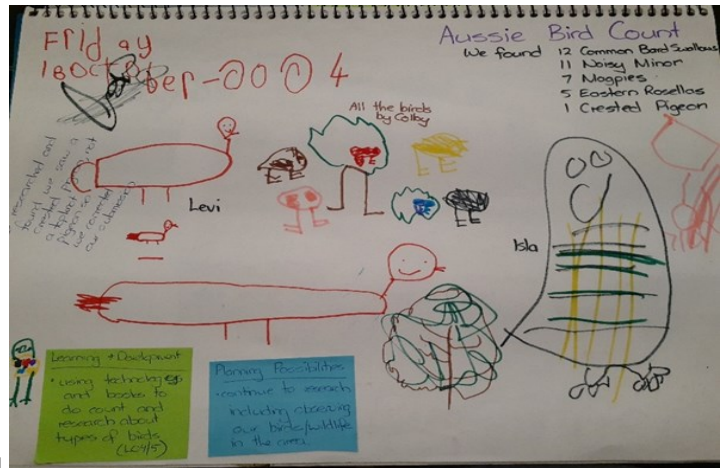

### Burrumbuttock Preschool's Aussie Bird Count

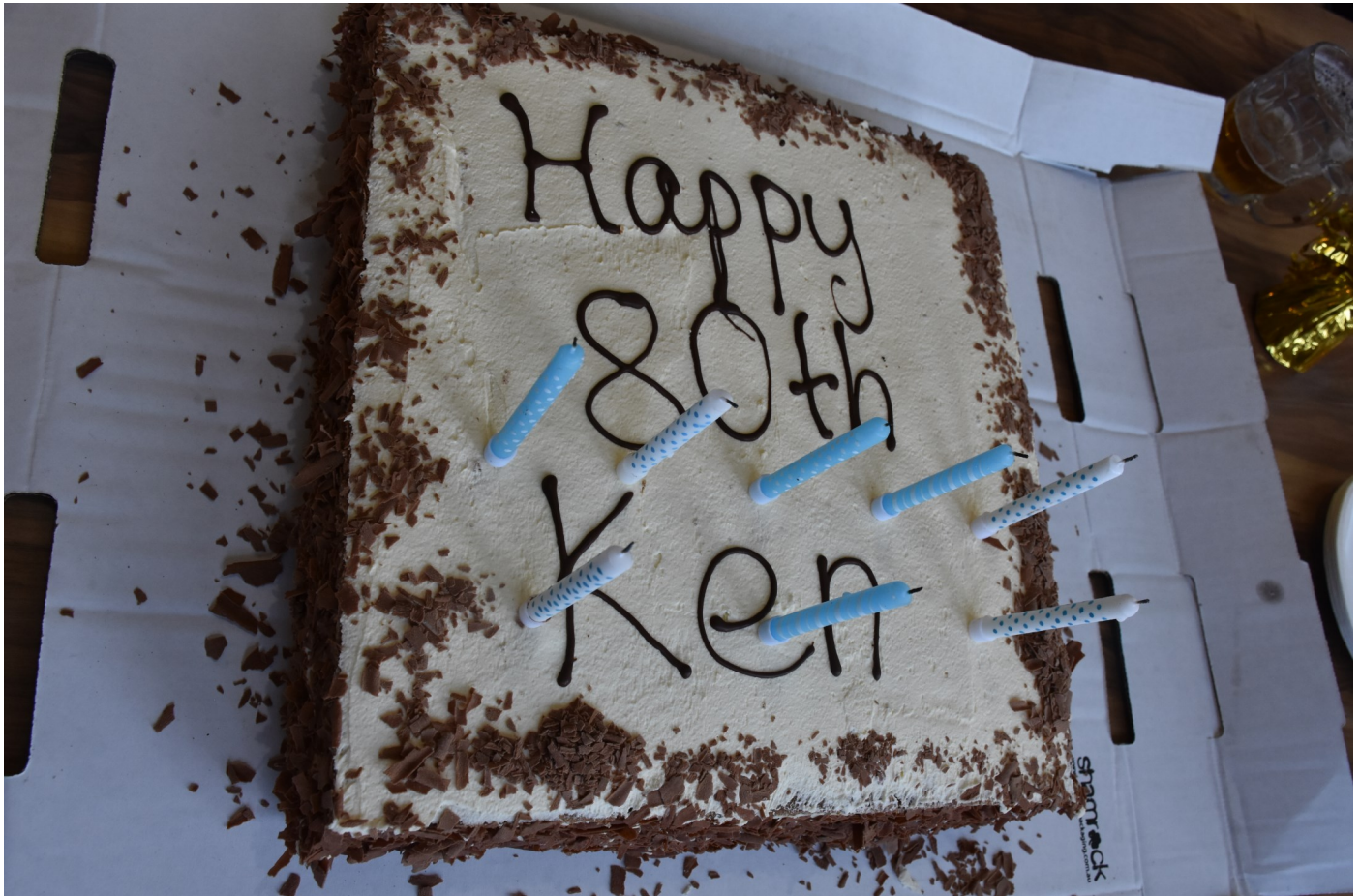

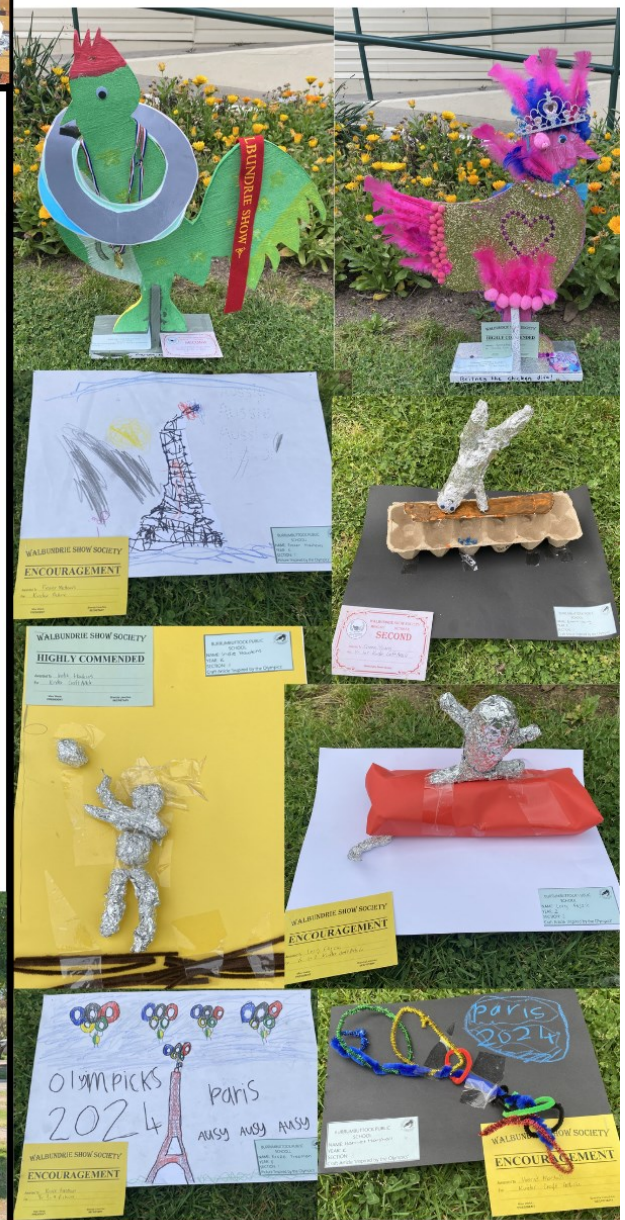


## Walbundrie Show Art
