# WHY RECORD HISTORY – PART 6 1958 Jaycees President - Don Lowe YEAR HIGHLIGHTS

- Main project hospital extension programme 'which ended up including painting'
- Big increase in Diary sales 50
- Bruno Biti won Public Speaking Contest
- Working bee at cemetery
- Organised 1st Cabaret Ball to be held in Culcairn.
- Ron, Neville and Don represented Culcairn at Southern Zone Conference at Albury in debating.
- Held several barbeques and social nights at Darcy Robinson's
- Many delegates attended area and Zone Conferences.

#### **HOSPITAL EXTENSION**

The Culcairn District Hospital received a grant to add a new wing and operating theatre.

The community raised funds to support these extensions, and with construction completed, the hospital board asked for community help with painting.

Jaycees put up their hand. Over several weeks, at weekends and nights, the Jaycee team and other volunteers prepared and painted this new facility.

We also ran a cabaret ball to help fund the cost of the paint.

The project was a big success for the community and many members learnt how to paint.

#### 1958 - 1964 CULCAIRN DISTRICT CEMETERY

The long-standing Cemetery Trust Committee ceased to exist in the late 1940s, leaving the cemetery without management. In 1958 the secretary of the Culcairn Hospital, Mr Ted Schulz, asked the Chapter if it would establish a committee to assess the state of the cemetery and recommend solutions.

This was undertaken, resulting in a raft of recommendations to restore this twelve-acre resting place of pioneers and citizens. Major problems identified were:

 White ants had destroyed fence posts, allowing cattle from the adjacent town common to enter the cemetery.

- 2. A visitor had picked and planted wild wattle on a grave years before, resulting in a jungle of scrub wattle across half of the eastern section.
- 3. Rabbits were having a field day in dry grass and overgrown shrubbery.
- 4. The entrance gate was mangled.

Early in 1958, Jaycees organised a community working bee. In one day, scrub wattle was removed, rabbits were attacked with ferrets, brawn and sheep dogs, graves and fences repaired, and with victor mowers everywhere revealing a totally different cemetery to be proud of. A spring working bee continued each year with community help.

In 1962 Jaycees raised finance and employed a part time cemetery caretaker, this continued for three years.

The following year Jaycees re-established a Cemetery Management Committee to oversee the cemetery. Before handing the reins over, a toilet was erected and an entrance ramp with brick sides and steel archway was erected. (However, the first contractor in a Pantech truck to arrive drove straight through it, instead of using the gate, and wiped it out.)

Soon after, the NSW Government legislated that all public cemeteries be the responsibility of Local Government.



# Culcairn Welcomes New Doctor and Expanded Health Services

Exciting news for the Culcairn community! A new medical general practice, *Culcairn Mediclinic*, open Mon-Fri, has opened its doors, bringing additional healthcare services to the region. Led by Dr. Toby Ezekwe, the clinic operates from 23 Balfour Street, the premises formerly occupied by Dr. Bond. Joining him is Dr. Marguerite Harb, further strengthening medical support in the town.

To mark the occasion and welcome the doctors to the town, the Culcairn Local Health Advisory Committee is hosting a free community sausage sizzle on Saturday, 12 April 2025, from 9:00 to 11:00 AM. The event will take place outside 23 Balfour Street, providing an opportunity for residents to meet Dr. Toby and learn more about the services available at the clinic.

## Culcairn Mediclinic: A New Era in Local Healthcare

Dr. Toby brings a wealth of experience in general practice, preventive care, and chronic disease management. The clinic will offer a wide range of services, including:

- General consultations
- Preventive care and chronic disease management
- Specialised skin care treatments
- Health education
- Telemedicine for remote consultations
- Home and nursing home visits

Additionally, Dr. Toby is in the process of securing Visiting Medical Officer credentials, which will enable him to work at the Culcairn Multi-Purpose Service (hospital and aged care facility).

## New Health Hub: A Community Investment

In a landmark collaboration, the Culcairn Local Health Advisory Committee, Greater Hume Council,

and the Culcairn Lions Club have joined forces to purchase the former NAB building at 31A Balfour Street. This strategic investment ensures that Culcairn has the necessary infrastructure to support its growing healthcare needs.

The purchase was made possible through:

- Culcairn Local Health Advisory Committee trust funds from the sale of Kiltearn House
- Greater Hume Council health initiative funds, also linked to Kiltearn House
- A generous bequest from the late Alan Fifield, held by the Culcairn Lions Club

## Expanding Health Services in Culcairn

The newly acquired building will serve as a complementary health hub to support additional medical and allied health services, including:

- Diabetes education and dietetics
- Speech pathology
- Podiatry
- Physiotherapy
- Community health initiatives, such as a new mums' support group

The final composition of services will emerge over the balance of 2025 – once we know the mix of services Dr. Toby is able to secure at the Culcairn Mediclinic.

A special thanks to Henty Bendigo Bank, which has expressed in-principal support for funding the necessary renovations to bring the facility up to standard. Their willingness to invest in the health and well-being of Culcairn is greatly appreciated.

## IN YOUR GARDEN

After a dry time in March we look forward to some April rain, while the soil is still warm and good growth possible.

VEGIES Clean up remaining summer vegies. Harvest the last of the cucumbers, tomatoes and zucchinis. Pickles and chutney time

Melons should be ready now and smaller pumpkins, Butternut and trombones. large jap and qld blues will keep maturing until a frost.

SOW broad beans, carrots, parsnips, beetroot, peas and silver beet.

PLANT OUT Seedlings of cauliflower, cabbage, broccoli at intervals to extend your harvest of these winter vegetables. Red, white and brown onion seedlings will grow through winter if put in now.

PEARS and APPLES will be in season over the next few months and lend themselves to many options, Pies, baked, sauces and chutneys as well as being delicious eaten fresh.

It's Bulb time .Chill tulips in the fridge before planting out.. Frost tolerant flowers for Autumn include cyclamen,(in pots or in the garden) stock, dianthus, calendula, larkspur.

Grow wallflowers for their perfume. Anenome, ranunculus, and pansies, Iceland poppies and red poppies (to bloom in November for Remembrance Day) There is still time for sweet peas, on frames or fences. Check for Autumn colour on deciduous trees in Nurseries now.

Walnuts and quinces are coming into season .The white cockatoos have won again, but I will buy some quinces to bake - red and delicious.

I recently visited "MAYFIELD", a private garden between Oberon and Bathurst. It is 120acres and part of a large property, It is a cold climate garden and said to be the largest private garden in the Southern Hemisphere open to the public. Trees are various pines, elms, oaks, birches, and other trees and shrubs that withstand snow, lots of azaleas and rhododendrons line the many pathways. A huge lake and an amazing water garden cover one section. Caves, waterfalls, and bridges add to the mystery of this incredible garden. I walked for almost 4 hours and only saw part of it. A visit again in Spring could be on the agenda! A magnificent work in progress as the owner travels the world to find new and different plants. Well worth a weekend in Bathurst to have time to visit "Mayfield".

Our gardens may never be "Mayfields", but as we work in them to grow vegies and flowers we gain a large amount of enjoyment and satisfaction both in growing plants and sharing the beauty of our patch.


