VALE – MARY DUGAN

Mary Dugan will be remembered for always doing things in the best possible way. Mary is held in the highest regard for her cattle knowledge and fine embroidery and sewing skills.

Mary ran the Gerogery Common along with Alex, for as long as I can remember. Over this time, Mary always had a milking cow and usually a couple of weaner steers to fatten. These always had names such as Stewie Stewing Steak, Eddie Edible or similar Mary's milking cows were always Jerseys and quite exceptional not only in temperament but also for the quality milk they gave. Mary would always separate the milk for the cream and make butter, which was always used for cooking. I especially remember Mary's cow, Beauty who Mary would let us milk every second week. Mary was always critical of pasteurised milk and knew her milk was the best for growing children. It was lovely to watch Mary's cattle handling skills. She had no trouble teaching poddy calves to drink or move bulls or cows from one paddock to the next – always chatting to them and gently coercing them along. Cattle at any age just did what she wanted them to.

Mary had a big influence on our family. She usually helped to select our show cattle for Sydney Show and had great pride when they won. Mary and Alex always looked after our place when we went on holidays and we knew our cattle were in the best possible hands. Mary and Alex were exceptional!

Mary's handcrafts were the best in the district as evidenced in all the local shows around and including Royal Sydney & Canberra Royal. Mary did fine embroidery where her attention to detail and her selection of materials were exquisite. Mary also made beautiful dresses that she smocked and embroidered for her granddaughters, Bronwyn, Natalie and Rachael. Mary also kindly made some beautiful dresses for our two daughters who cherished them and kept them for their daughters to wear. Our granddaughters have now put them away for their daughters so they are treasured heirlooms.

Everyone who knew Mary would have a great story to tell. She was always kind and caring and contributed much to the Gerogery Common as well as the community. Mary will be remembered as a wonderful lady. She passed away on November 7th 2024, at Jindera Gardens Aged Care surrounded by loved ones. Our sincere condolences to Karenne and Bronwyn, Elaine, Wilfred and Family and Donna, Jeff and family.
