#### COMMANDER HOLBROOK RSL WAR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship commenced in 1965 with financial support from Commander Norman D. Holbrook, the RSL Sub-branch and individual donors. After Commander Holbrook's passing, Mrs Gundula Holbrook continued supporting the scholarship with some extremely generous donations. Thank you to the many individuals and families who have also donated to the scholarship since its inception.

The job of the trustees is to manage the investments, to ensure there is enough money to fund the new and existing scholarship recipients each year. At the end of this term, Year 6 students from



our local schools are invited to sit the annual Commander Holbrook RSL War Memorial Scholarship test. The Trustees set and supervise the test, which is held at Holbrook Public School.

There has recently been a change to the board of trustees. Mr Ian Wettenhall has vacated his position after twenty-five years of tenure. The late Max Meiklejohn (then Chairperson), invited Ian to join in 1999. In 2007, Ian was elected assistant treasurer and held this position for 18 years, assisting James Ross (Treasurer). Ian's father, Hugh Wettenhall, became a board member in the early 1970's and served on the board until his passing in 1988. Ian's aunt, Mrs Margaret Heriot was an original trustee, serving as treasurer for 10 years from 1965 – 1975. Ian's late mother, Mrs Patsy Wettenhall, was a great supporter of the scholarship and generously donated annually.

lan has witnessed numerous changes during his time on the board of trustees. For instance, the number of local schools involved is now only two, with the closure of the surrounding small schools. In 2022, the Trustees decided that with a substantial increase in funds the scholarship would cover six years of high school instead of only four.

lan said, 'It was an honour and privilege to serve on the board, which has always been stable and cohesive and a pleasure to be involved with.' The Trustees welcome Mrs Ursula Harbison to the board in lan's place. Ursula brings a wealth of knowledge and experience from her years in the education sector as a former principal and teacher.






#### PLANT PICK PLATE




