#### FATHER JOMER CALMA TO BE GUEST SPEAKER AT ROTARY

Holbrook Rotarians will welcome Father Jomer Calma as guest speaker at their dinner meeting at the RS Club on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2024, 6.00pm for 6.15pm.

Coincidently, Father had a connection with Rotary back in the Philippines through friends over a period of three years. Rotary president Belinda Izzard said, "We extend an open invitation to members of the



community to join us for dinner and later, enjoy Father Jomer's presentation starting at 7pm.

Father Jomer was born in the Philippines to Oscar and Merlina Calma on the 17<sup>th</sup> January 1985. He is the eldest son and grew up with his parents and five siblings on the archipelago's largest island Luzon in the province of Zambales.

From a young age he wanted to be a priest and after finishing High School, started studies for the priesthood at a very young age in his homeland. He left the seminary for a while and looked for a job, finding one in his local parish teaching catechism to the schools located over a wide area in the mountains and the seas. In fact, many were isolated and there was one trip up a day in the mountains, which meant an overnight stay and down the mountain the next day. A similar pattern occurred on the islands and seas.

In 2012 Father Jomer arrived in Australia to study for the priesthood over a period of seven years at St John Marie Vianney College, Wagga Wagga. Completing his studies in 2018, Father was ordained in 2019 and assigned briefly to the Cathedral Parish in Wagga Wagga. Assignations as assistant priest followed in Griffith for over two years, then Kooringal, Wagga Wagga, for 12 months, and eight months at St Patrick's, Albury. In 2023 Father Jomer was assigned administrator to Holbrook and Culcairn Parishes.


**BSM Pasture Nutrition Training:** Last week Steph, HLN's Sustainable Agriculture Project Officer, had the opportunity to spend the day in Albury with the Back Paddock Company team, developing skills in pasture nutrition management, presented by David Harbison (DR Agriculture) and Tom Cowlrick.


The training focussed on understanding different nutrients in the soil profile, the impact each nutrient has on pasture production and connecting this to profit drivers with a farm system (how to make money from pasture!).

Key discussion points included: \* Understanding drivers of profit on-farm (such as DSE and feed curves) to develop strategic approaches to achieve success on-farm. \* Analysis of soil tests, understanding of soil ameliorants and fertiliser products to determine a 'plan of action' to achieve healthy pastures.

\* Detailed discussion on lime, phosphorus, potassium and sulphur and PBI. \* Ruminant nutrition requirements for productivity & profitability and understanding the nutritional requirements for livestock that can be met through healthy pasture production.

Steph is working on several pasture-related projects, including Resilient Pastures (under the NSW Drought Hub) and Testing Tropicals in the South West Slopes (funded through MLA), so she will be able to use the skills developed through this training in her project work.

#### **PLANT PICK PLATE**

I recently toured The National Arboretum Canberra which is home to 92 forests of rare, endangered and symbolic trees



from Australia and around the world. Set on a site of 250 ha (618 acres), over 44,000 trees are growing providing visitors with panoramic views.

I expected to explore garden rooms of specific plant families but these were few. However the incredible Bonsai and Penjing display captured my heart. Bonsai is the art of growing miniature trees in small pots which having been adapted by the ancient Chinese was probably perfected by the Japanese. Penjing means "pot scenery" originating 2000 years ago in China. This artistry includes rocks, ground covers, small figurines or objects incorporated into the Bonsai design.

The oldest tree in the collections is a 144 year old Box-Leaf privet planted in 1880. A perfect traditional domed design in a shallow pot where I imagined delicate fairies dancing under its lush green canopy. For me, the most eye catching display was the 47 year old Azalea "Encore Autumn Empress" in full bloom exhibiting candy pink flowers massed over the entire domed canopy. It was absolutely beautiful, a "Look at Me" specimen.

The very knowledgeable volunteer suggested that viewing the Bonsai from underneath provides a greater understanding and appreciation for the artists "sculpting of the living tree", the balanced design of roots, trunk and branch structure. This is particularly more evident with modern Bonsai design using a larger tree, but still miniature, shaped in a more natural state. For example, the windswept look of a Melaleuca Tea Tree or the multiple branch root system of the Morton Bay Fig, both of which were on display.

I found the whole exhibit totally stimulating for both my mind, body and soul, a must to be repeated.


