COMMANDER HOLBROOK RSL WAR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

On behalf of the Trustees, Mrs Judy Ross presented the scholarship awards at the Holbrook Public School's Annual Presentation of Awards on Thursday 12th December 2024.

The scholarship was set up in 1965. The Late Commander Norman D. Holbrook provided the original capital together with the Holbrook RSL sub-branch. Since then, many donations have been generously made by civic minded individuals and local organisations.

Key words in the Trust Deed that governs the purpose of the fund are: The promotion and encouragement of education of children in the Holbrook district. The principle being of assistance, not reward.

The scholarship is unique in that it is only available to students in local Holbrook schools. Unlike other scholarships this one is open to all students no matter their circumstances or what secondary school they plan to attend. All Year 6 students from our local schools are eligible and encouraged to sit the exam, which includes papers in English, mathematics, science and writing. It is a wonderful opportunity afforded to our local students in Holbrook. Commander Holbrook's wish was to provide financial assistance to students to enable them to complete their secondary education and so prepare themselves well for further study or training.

There are two scholarships, the major and minor awards. With a very large donation from the Estate of Mrs Gundula Holbrook in 2022, the Trust was able to increase the yearly scholarship payments and from 2023 the recipients' scholarships were extended from 4 – 6 years to include Years 11 and 12. The payments which are made annually are conditional on the students' continued academic progress, effort and application. Recipients are asked to forward their end of year school report to the Trustees each year.

Total payments made annually are sourced from the interest received from the capital invested. The Trust does rely heavily on donations, which are gratefully received at any time and are tax deductible.

In 2006, with a generous donation from the RSL Sub-branch, an Encouragement Award was included. In 2016, the Log Cabin Trust donated money to cover two Encouragement Awards. When the Log Cabin was sold in 2019, a very substantial donation was received and invested. It was the Log Cabin Trust's wish to offer two Encouragement Awards, one to a student from each school. As the Log Cabin was used for the 'Youth of Holbrook,' encouraging students to keep persevering with their studies seemed a very fitting award.

Fourteen students sat the test, all being from Holbrook Public School, as St. Patrick's School, Holbrook, did not have any students sit the test this year.

The winner of the Major Award was Alex Mohr.

The winner of the Minor Award was William Finlay.

The Encouragement Award went to Asher Kenney.

Congratulations to these three students – the Commander Holbrook RSL War Memorial recipients for 2024.

Thank you to the Holbrook Public School principal, Mrs Louise Purss-Semple, and staff for their support and assistance to ensure the scholarship test was able to be held at the school in 2024.

All gardeners know that spending time in the garden is restorative. Pottering with plants help you



unwind and calm the mind, regardless of age. While sometimes near back breaking tasks need attending, the overall benefit to body and mind is unparalleled. Encouraging children in particular, to become interested in gardening could lead to a lifelong journey of plant appreciation, knowledge, a calmer mindset and ultimately the joy of eating a vegetable that has been attended to and watched grow for so long.

It was not until I became a mother in my early 30's that my interest in a vegetable garden developed. In contrast, our grandson is five and already a full on lover of gardening. Living in a 3rd floor apartment in the city his only access to vegetable growing is using small pots on a small balcony. On a recent visit to our garden, with encouragement, he learned to use the paths between my garden beds. He was amazed that potatoes grew under the soil and helped dig them out with his hands. All he needs is guidance and to be shown. At the age of five, his lifelong lessons in gardening are just starting.

As gardeners, we are still learning and passing on knowledge to others. It is never too young or too old to start your own plot.



- Before you do your gift or food shopping, decide how much money you can afford




to spend. Then stick to your budget. Challenge friends and family to do the same.

HOW GERMANTON BECAME HOLBROOK: A LITTLE BACKGROUND

A significant amount of German settlement occurred in the Riverina during the second half of the 19th Century. It was perceived by military authorities as a German region and the location of many disloyal aliens during World War I. Several new names were considered by the Germanton Shire Council before settling on 'Marton', taking inspiration from Captain James Cook's birthplace in England. However, the Commonwealth Lands Department rejected the name because it had already been used in Queensland. After an additional round of possible names, two names stood out: Kitchener and Holbrook. In the end, Holbrook was chosen, to

honour British naval lieutenant (and later commander) Norman Douglas Holbrook, the first naval Victoria Cross winner during World War I for his bravery in charge of the submarine HMS B11 against the Turks in the Dardanelles in December 1914.



The town's original name refers to a Germanborn resident who lived in the area early on, John Pabst - travellers called his residence 'the Germans'. It should be noted that there were four grandchildren of John Pabst who served in the Australian forces in World War I, as well as other Pabst family members who fought and died in the conflict.

Holbrook: O name of warrior bold, We hail thee with joy, For 'Germanton' is cold, And 'Holbrook' is the boy.

BUSHFIRE PREPAREDNESS

A well prepared home is more likely to survive a bush fire. Even if your plan is to leave early, the more you prepare your home, the more likely it will survive a bush fire or ember attack. A well prepared home can also be easier for you or firefighters to defend, and is less likely to put your neighbours' homes at risk. A well prepared home will also give you more protection if a fire threatens suddenly and you cannot leave.

Here are some basic maintenance tips to prepare your property:

- Clean your gutters of leaves and twigs
- Install metal gutter guards
- Repair damaged or missing tiles on the roof
- Install fine metal mesh screens on windows and doors
- Fit seals around doors and windows to eliminate gaps
- Enclose the areas under the house
- Repair or cover gaps in external walls
- Attach a fire sprinkler system to gutters
- Keep lawns short and gardens well maintained
- Cut back trees and shrubs overhanging buildings
- Clean up fallen leaves, twigs and debris around the property
- Have hoses long enough to reach around your house
- If you have a pool, tank or dam, put a Static Water Supply (SWS) sign on your property

entrance, so firefighters know where they can get water

• Check and maintain adequate levels of home and contents insurance. Ensure it is up to date.

ALERT LEVELS

During a bush fire, Alert Levels are used to give you an indication of the level of threat from a fire. Remember – don't wait for a warning. Some fires start and spread so quickly there may not be any time for a warning. If you get a Bush Fire Alert, you must take it seriously. Failure to take action can result in death or injury to you or your family members.

There are three levels of Bush Fire Alerts:

Advice: A fire has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.

Watch And Act: There is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start taking action now to protect you and your family.

Emergency Warning: An Emergency Warning is the highest level of Bush Fire Alert. You may be in danger and need to take action immediately. Any delay now puts your life at risk.

For some fires, you may hear a warning message over your radio or television, such as a siren, or you may receive an Emergency Alert text message or phone call. Other fires may start so quickly that there will be no time for any warning at all.


