HELPING VILLAGE KIDS IN CAMBODIA

Have you ever considered supporting a project that will bring more educational, health and environmental opportunities to village children in Cambodia?

John Parry, President of the Rotary Club of Bellbridge Lake Hume, will be speaking to Holbrook Rotarians about a RAWCS project (Rotary Australia World Community Service) in Cambodia to take place in 2025.

"A group pf 18 volunteers will travel to a poor village in Siem Reap, Cambodia, with the objective of providing English tuition, study lights, bicycles, and desks, to increase desperately needed educational opportunities for the children.

"The raising of the standard of education for their children will lead to lifting the village out of poverty. The group will also help with water quality, tree planting, general maintenance, health and education."

"This is truly a District 9790 effort initiated by the Rotary Club of Ivanhoe and supported by the Rotary Clubs of Pascoe Vale, Rutherglen, and Bellbridge – Lake Hume," Mr Parry said.

John Parry is in his second year as president of Bellbridge – Lake Hume, having joined Rotary in Wynyard, Tasmania in 2011. He lives in Bellbridge with wife Denise, and his main social interest has been acting and singing in local theatre where he has performed principal roles at the Entertainment Centre.

WOOLPACK INN MUSEUM


What an amazing month we had in July with the Bald Archies in Holbrook. Lots of people in town spending their money.

A constitutional referendum will be held on Saturday, 14 September 2024 for electors to consider whether the Council area should continue to be divided into wards.


All electors will be asked to answer "yes" or "no" to the following questions:


Currently Greater Hume is divided into three wards that elect 9 Councillors in total. Do you favour:

- 1. Abolishing this ward system in favour of a single area consisting of all voters that elects 9 councillors?
- 2. Making no change to this system; That is three wards and 9 councillors remain?"

If the removal of wards is supported by a majority of formal votes cast at the 2024 election, the 2028 local government elections would be conducted as an undivided area (without wards).

You are welcome to call in to the Opportunity Shop during opening hours – Monday to Friday – 10:00am to 3:00pm and Saturday – 10:00am to12:00 midday.

We stock a large range of clothes, books, household items and furniture. Stock is constantly changing so please come in regularly and see what is available.

We are very appreciative of the donated goods we receive from the community. Donations may be dropped off during opening hours. Could we please ask that donated items are clean and in good condition. With the new council bin system, we have limited ability to dispose of items that are not of a saleable standard.

The Opportunity Shop is staffed by a committed group of community and church volunteers. We appreciate the support given by many individuals, both in the sorting of donated goods, and serving at the shop. If you are interested in volunteering at the Opportunity Shop, please contact one of the friendly volunteers who will point you in the right direction. All our volunteers are required to undergo training of approximately 1-2 hours.

Mainly Music: Our mainly music program is in its second term of operation. The program is

intended for 0-5 year old children and their carer. It follows a simple formula of music, food and fun! We commence with a 30 minute music session, followed by morning tea then playtime. Parents and carers are offered a cuppa and cake while the children enjoy supervised play. Our program runs for nine weeks during the school term, commencing in week two of the term.

We currently have several places open for new families. If you are interested, you are welcome to drop in to the Holbrook Anglican Church Hall, on Young St, on a Wednesday morning at 9:30am and speak with our coordinator Sharon. The cost is \$5 per family per week.

Sunday Church Services: The Anglican Parish of Holbrook meets every Sunday at St Paul's in Young St Holbrook at 9:30am. Services last for around one hour and are followed by morning tea in the hall. Our services include a mix of traditional and contemporary music, Bible readings, prayers and a Bible talk. We also meet at St Mark's Woomargama on the second Sunday of the month at 11:15am, followed by a cuppa. In October, our service will be a "Blessing of the Animals". All are welcome at our services.


TENNIS


