TALKIN' TOUGH WITH 'LEGLESS AND BLIND'

Laughter, admiration and emotion filled the venues whilst Talkin' Tough speakers Ben Pettingill and Mike Rolls (affectionately know as 'Legless and Blind') were in town.

Over 600 people from the Holbrook and surrounding communities attended the inspirational talks by Ben and Mike over two days in late August. Two sessions at Billabong High School meant that all available students from both St Paul's, Walla Walla and Billabong High School heard how both Ben and Mike faced life changing health crises in their teens and learnt to move forward with incredible purpose and fulfillment.

After losing 98% of his sight overnight at age 16, Ben was the first to say he bottled up many frustrations and worries over a number of years to ease the concerns of family. He finally opened up to his father and was able to face the changes his new life held with more direction. Mike left on his first end of season football trip aged 18, and woke up 6 weeks later in hospital after losing his lower leg, most of his nose and two fingers to Meningococcal disease. A couple of years later he elected to have his other leg amputated below the knee to end a cycle of infection and medical issues. His approach to the future is incredibly positive and proactive. He is a keen golfer and

Ben a keen water skier, both with young families they lead very busy and dynamic lives.

Together they travel to all parts of the country speaking to school students and groups about tackling the dark times in life and the importance of mateship, communication and connection. They engage passionately on the importance of checking on and recognising when your mates may be struggling and in need of support. Make time and ask the question "Are you OK?" - more than once if you need to.

They backed up the High School sessions with a Ladies' night, a Men's night and a Primary School (Years 4, 5 and 6) session at Holbrook Public

School with St Patrick's School students present. The women's night was a sell out with 116 women present and 93 men attended the men's function at the Sporting Complex.

Taking the opportunity of great crowds, the organisers asked Lu Lindon, Nurse Educator from Holbrook MPS to give a refresher on CPR and the use of Defibrillator machines (which are now common around town) at the ladies' event. Jeff Moat, Paramedic from Tumbarumba, went through similar demonstrations on the men's night.

The events were a joint project of Holbrook Landcare Network and the Holbrook Local Health Advisory Committee (LHAC) and kindly sponsored by funding from the (FRRR) Foundation of Rural and Regional Renewal, RABO Bank Community Fund, Hume Bank, Greater Hume Council, Holbrook Rotary and Murrumbidgee Health. 

HOLBROOK RSL SUB-BRANCH

On 14 September each year, we observe National Peacekeepers' Day. It's the anniversary of the day Australia became the world's first peacekeepers to deploy into the field, in the Netherlands East Indies (now Indonesia) in 1947. Since 1947, tens of thousands of Australians have served as members of a peacekeeping force and 16 have lost their lives. This day is a time for us to recognise and remember their service and sacrifice.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Apart from roses, tulips are recognised and identified as the



most romantically significant flowers worldwide. A flower that is given with love and affection, this traditional Dutch bulb is usually grown in the cooler climatic regions in the world, with the Netherlands producing approximately 60% of the world's tulips.

Their popularity is no surprise when the eye is captured by the dazzling colours of red, maroon, yellow, pink, white and variegated cultivars. The tulip flowers are beautifully formed bell shaped blooms on top of long slender stems, perfect for a vase display. Although this is the traditional image, hybrid bulbs are available that produce tulips in dwarf form, with open cup shaped blooms of varied sizes as well as frilled petals and softer, muted colours. Regardless of the variety, tulips create the greatest impact when planted close in clumps en masse, therefore, it is no wonder many gardeners regard tulips as the most spectacular of all spring flowering bulbs.

Tulip lovers are in for a treat this Spring as many celebrations and displays of the tulip are open to the public. In the Southern Highlands town of Bowral 80,000 plants in bloom are featured in Corbett Gardens (September 13 to 30). Victoria's Dandenong Ranges town of Silvan will host the Tesselaar Tulip Festival (September 13 to October 13) and Canberra's Floriade Festival will be held in Commonwealth Park (September 14 to October 13). So if you would like to Tip Toe through the Tulips these festivals, inspired by colour, culture and creativity, will not disappoint.


