## The National Museum of Australian Pottery has recently acquired **THE JONATHAN LEAK 1823 VICTORY COMMEMORATIVE WINE JUG**

This 200-year-old 20cm tall wheel thrown, salt glazed unique commemorative jug is adorned with fine coggle decorations, Prince of Wales plumes, press-moulded handle and spout featuring a facemask of Bacchus (The God of Wine), embossed with two panels of women dancing at a Bacchanalian festival, one playing a triangle and the other sacrificing a hare to Bacchus, and both sides of an 'Arthur Duke of Wellington' medallion, struck in 1820 to commemorate the victory at the battle of Vittoria in June 1813, against the French during the Napoleonic Wars.

The medal is believed to have been brought to Australia in December 1821 by Sir Thomas Brisbane the sixth Governor of New South Wales, who took part in the battle, and may have had Jonathan Leak commissioned to produce the jug in early 1823 to celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the victory.

The jug is impressed on the base: 'J. LEAK' and has a very smooth and even wear mark around the base that shows it has been well used and looked after over a long period of time.

This 1823 Victory Commemorative Wine jug made by Jonathan Leak, whose few surviving pieces are the earliest pottery produced in Australia marked with a potter's stamp, is a key piece in Australian pottery history and is widely regarded as the single most important and historically significant MARKED piece of early Australian convict pottery ever discovered and the most decorative example in existence.

The jug's distinctive design reflects early European influences and holds both aesthetic and historical value in the development of early Australian pottery and offers a glimpse into Australia's colonial past, shedding light on Leak's life and talent, who was known for his craftsmanship and is considered a pioneer of Australian pottery.

## LAUNCH OF REVAMPED REVEGETATION GUIDES AT HENTY FIELD DAYS

Last week marked a significant milestone for Landcare in the Murray and Murrumbidgee regions with the official launch at the Henty Machinery Field Days of the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition of the Riverina and South West Slopes Revegetation Guides, and an accompanying interactive website. Holbrook Landcare's CEO, Dr Alison Southwell, announced the launch at "The Stump", with few seeing the irony of announcing the 'release' of revegetation guides while standing atop the stump of an old tree.

A small but passionate group of people came along especially to support the launch, with many members of the public also in attendance.

### A bit about the Guides

The guides, cornerstones of land restoration efforts for over 25 years, have been modernised to provide a vital resource for revegetation practices in the face of carbon and environmental markets, global sustainability demands, and a changing climate. They represent the collective wisdom of the most experienced practitioners from across the Murray, Murrumbidgee, and Riverina regions.

For over three decades, farmers, land managers, Landcare, and natural resource management agencies have been actively engaged in land revegetation and restoration. The original regionally specific guides, developed in the late 1990s, played a crucial role in the success of these efforts. Today, a network of skilled practitioners has emerged, building on the legacy of the original guides and practical experience with farmers.

As we enter a new era of revegetation, it is imperative to include and listen to First Nations

voices. Ensuring their perspectives are heard is vital for creating the abundance and future thinking required to live with challenging and changing landscapes. The wisdom of generations who have cared for Country and are attuned to nature's rhythms offers invaluable solutions for restoration and sustainability.

Revegetation opportunities are also being driven by farmers and farming businesses to meet the needs of consumers and industry frameworks for sustainable farm reporting, as well as opportunities for participating in environmental markets. Drought and farm business resilience further necessitate adapting revegetation practices to the realities of climate change and ensuring recommendations align with the latest research.

Thanks to support from the Australian Government's Future Drought Fund, the content of these guides has been reviewed, updated, and made more accessible through an online portal and printed resources. This project was a collaborative effort between Holbrook Landcare Network and Murrumbidgee Landcare Incorporated.

The new revegetation guides empower farmers and their advisors to navigate the complexities of managing and increasing vegetation on their farms. While it is an invaluable resource, it does not replace the importance of seeking on-site advice from practitioners, ecologists, and experts in Landcare and natural resource management agencies.

## PLANT PICK PLATE

I have spent a large part of my weekend watering my garden due to low rainfall this past season. When digging down into the garden, I was surprised how shallow the moisture has penetrated with the surface drying out quickly as Spring temperatures rise. This is also a reminder to maintain watering of pots and plants under house eaves or shade covers. Equally important is daily watering of young flower seedlings and perennial cuttings which have been recently planted out.

A water reminder is also a fertiliser reminder, particularly for hungry plants such as citrus, roses and leafy green vegetables. Fruit trees with Spring growth will also love a dressing of nitrogen rich fertiliser. An all-purpose fertiliser applied to onions and garlic, still in the ground, will boost their last months of maturing bulbs.

Although the days are warming up, the temperature is still cool especially at night. As the soil is still quite cold, vegetable seeds directly sown will struggle to sprout until the ground temperature rises. Likewise, hold off planting the ever-popular tomato plant until mid-October. Some gardeners in our area even wait until early November when the chance of frost is diminished. I know stores are displaying beautiful strong looking tomatoes but do not be tempted to purchase unless you have a glass house or an indoor sun soaked position to place your plant in for a few weeks.

National Gardening Week, October 13 to 19, would be an ideal timeline to aim for when the planting a Spring crop. This week provides an opportunity for the community and gardeners to engage in horticultural pursuits, be it through a garden club, a tree planting program or individuals creating a garden in their own back/front yards.

## FOOTBALL



**RESERVES:** The Holbrook reserves have marched into their third-consecutive grand final after flaying the CDHBU Power by 48 points at Walbundrie. The Brookers took control early, opening up a 25-point advantage by quarter time. Ollie Whitley was in fine form right from the get-go, and collected the official best-on-ground award for his efforts. Also getting plenty of possessions in the midfield were Coby Ross, ruckman Logan Hamilton, and the hard-working AJ Bender. Unlike their previous two battles with the Power this season, Holbrook's forward line functioned well. Lachie Trethowan (3 goals), Matt Sharp (2 goals), and Callum Langlands (2 goals) all kept the scoreboard ticking over. James Gledhill was rock-solid deep in defence, and his long kick-outs generally went to the Brookers' advantage. The match also contained the bizarre situation where a goal umpire was stretchered from the oval after colliding with a player.

**SENIORS:** Holbrook's seniors needed to get into the grand final via the preliminary final after they were beaten by Osborne by 12 points. A poor first term saw the Brookers 28 points down at the first break, although they managed to restrict the Tigers to 3 goals in the remaining quarters. After being under siege early, Holbrook did well to work there way back into the match, as Matt Bender and Corey McCarthy set about propelling the footy into attack. The Brookers' best period came in the second term when they slammed on three goals in six minutes, with Cody Hewat, Will Holmes, and Luke Gestier doing the damage. Andy Wettenhall was forced from the field with a dislocated finger, but some handiwork from a medical man saw him return to the fray. Holbrook did well to restrict Osborne to 7 goals, with Andrew Dear and Kieran McCarthy managing to

chop off plenty of the Tigers' attacking moves. Lachie Semmler got the best out of himself, and topped things off with a fine running goal in the third quarter.

**PRELIMINARY FINAL:** Holbrook's senior team advanced to the Hume League Grand Final after mauling the CDHBU Power by 98 points at Walbundrie. Spurred on by their vocal supporters, the Brookers took full advantage of the breeze in the first term, kicking the first six goals to go to the first break with a 23-point buffer. Josh Jones, Andrew Mackinlay, & Brad Carman all slotted two first-quarter goals, which had the Power defence under siege. Jones finished the day with six goals, and the official medal for best-on-ground. Holbrook were just as dominant kicking against the wind in the second term, kicking 5 goals to 1, and by half-time the Power were a shot bird. Will Holmes won possessions aplenty in the midfield, confirming his status as one of the Hume League's best players. The Brookers defence put in arguably their best effort for the season in restricting their opponents to four goals, with Andrew Dear, Cooper Walsh, Hayden Smith, and Kieren McCarthy linking up well when the Power ventured forward. Co-coaches Jones & Mackinlay were ecstatic with the pressure their players applied to the opposition, such as the tackling efforts of Sam Joyce, Ben Parker, & John Mitchell. 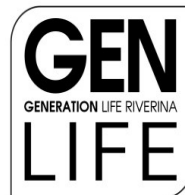

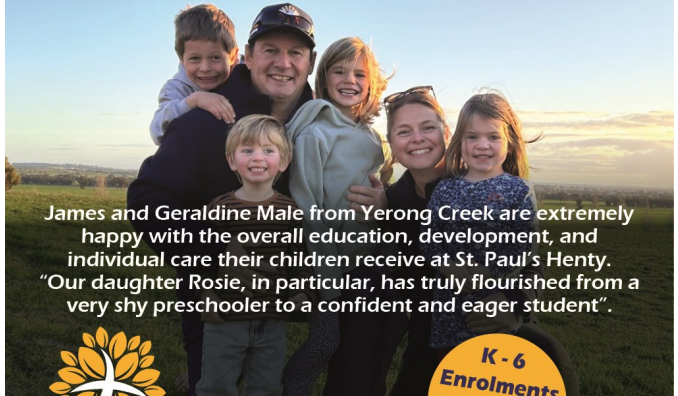

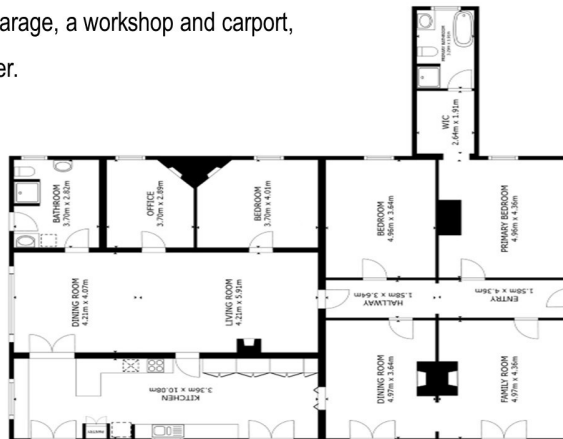
