FOOTBALL GRAND FINALS

Reserves: The Holbrook reserves capped off a brilliant season by mowing down the CDHBU Power by 49 points in the Hume League Grand Final. The Brookers entered the contest as a hot favourite after whipping the Power by 42 points a fortnight earlier, and once again played to their potential when it counted. The Power struck the first blow with a goal to Deagan Purcell in the second minute, however that was about as good as it got for the lads from Coreen. Holbrook, on the back of great work from Ollie Whitley, Logan Hamilton, and Fletcher Parker (4 goals) kicked the next 8 goals to put the contest to bed. Whitley's determination to win the ball in congested play was evident from the get-go, and he was a deserved winner of the official best-on-ground medal. Hamilton not only won a stack of hit-outs in his rucking role, he also regularly drove the Brookers into attack with his lengthy kicks. Coby Ross, unluckily dropped from the senior team, garnered a swag of kicks on a wing, thus giving Lachie Trethowan and Johnny Ward plenty to work with. Captain Nick Pugh led the charge in defence, while Hainsworth Cock, Hamilton Black, and Aidan Cox all played their hearts out for the duration. The win was a fitting way to bow out for Matt Sharp, who played his last match in the green-and-gold.

Seniors: Holbrook's dream of becoming the top dogs in the league again went up in flames at Walbundrie, losing to the Osborne Tigers by 35 points in the senior grand final. The Brookers looked the goods in the first term, taking advantage of the wind to post four goals, and open up a 16-point buffer over the minor premiers. From that point on though, Holbrook could only score 9 more points in the low-scoring contest. After the match, Brookers co-coach Andrew Mackinlay pointed to his teams inability to handle the Tigers pressure on the ball-carrier that proved pivotal. To their credit, the Holbrook players never threw in the towel. Andrew Dear and Kieran McCarthy had plenty on their plates in the back half, and both cleared the ball away from danger on many occasions. McCarthy even floated forward in the first term to slot a goal. Jayden Hucker spent most of the match in the ruck, and did all he could to feed the ball to the likes of Jock Triggs and Will Holmes. Other Brookers to have an impact were Cody Hewat, Sam Joyce, and Matt Bender. Holbrook looked to have scored their fifth goal in the second quarter from the boot of John Mitchell - however the field umpire overruled the goal umpire. That summed up how luck had deserted the Brookers.





FENG SHUI

Growing up in Communist China, I was quite surprised after arriving in Australia to see that the idea of Feng Shui is well embraced by some Western people. A friend of mine even wanted me to introduce her to a Feng Shui master to help solve her family problem.

There was one story of when a person passed away, a Feng Shui master boasted: "I can point to 10 possible items placed in the wrong position in this person's home." And some of his points were correct. Does Feng Shui work, or is destiny already set? Like the chicken and the egg, I would dare to guess that when chicken was created, egg was on its drawing board together, but I rather leave you to work out whether Feng Shui works... Feng Shui has been practiced by Chinese people for centuries but during the Communist

Feng Shui has been practiced by Chinese people for centuries, but during the Communist revolution, ordinary Chinese people were not allowed to openly practice it, but communist officials have been secretly following the practice in many aspects: their ancestor's graves, their houses and offices, or choosing dates for events, etc. As soon as a CCP (Chinese Communist Party) member takes office, they will firstly re-build their ancestor's grave. Because once they obtained position, they have access to acquire land and funds to use for themselves. To place one's ancestor's grave in the right place is regarded as the first important action in Feng Shui workout.

Communists in China did a crazy transformation on how Feng Shui is practiced in Chinese culture, and it led to a vicious level of competition in recent decades.

In 1989, the Chinese Government took the land of a prime position in Hong Kong, and built the China Bank on it, with the 3 knife shaped edges towards: The Government House of Hong Kong; The British army base in HK, and the head office of HSBC. The HK government then rushed to plant a garden that spanned wider than the government house, with full height trees forming a wall; and the head office of HSBC quickly built 2 large cannons on top

of their skyscraper... (pictured right)

In 2019, the Chinese government made an extension of the coastline by filling the ocean to build a new



west Jiu Long Railway station, the extension, in the shape of a snake head, connected with the railway, thus a complete giant snake, opening its mouth, pointed to the Sun Yetsen statue and museum on the opposite island. There are at least 7 colossal infrastructures in snake shaped form built in HK after 1998, the doom of Hong Kong democracy was in sight, as explained by some Hong Kong Feng Shui masters.

The first Feng Shui theories appeared in China: "The Yellow Emperor's House Sutra" is said to have been written by the Yellow Emperor in 3000BC, teaching of creating harmony between man and their residence, man with heaven and earth, with nature, and with the universe. Its doctrine was explained through the theories of tai chi, yin and yang, human spirits, Yi Ching, etc., and described the house shape as a body, the streams or water as the blood, ... etc. All things coordinate properly and elegantly, to create a prosperous outcome.

Recently, China has just successfully expanded its regional impact from Papua New Guinea to the Torres Strait since its acquisition of a large mining lease on Horn Island, Australia; on top of China's foot hold in the Darwin port, and many other ports and land in Australia. Major media have been diligently reporting about China's 'reasons' for these infrastructures, what do you think? and how many cannon statues we should build to prevent us not becoming second Hong Kong?

I am planning to hold an evening talk (6:30-9pm), to introduce some safe and effective Feng Shui knowledge, at the end of Oct. Bogong Moths - Call to Action: Zoos Victoria is tracking endangered Bogong Moths as they migrate across the nation to the alpine regions this spring. With numbers critically low, your sightings of Bogong Moths could help scientists work out what's happening to this vital species. Bogong Moths play an important role in the

ecosystem – including as a key spring food source for the Critically Endangered Mountain Pygmypossum.

We had one record in Holbrook last December and are on the lookout for more! If you see a Bogong Moth, take a photo and upload it to the Moth Tracker website via zoo.org.au/moth-tracker. Or send it to us with details of where you saw it and we will upload it for you. Remember, Bogong Moths can be found day or night, and you don't necessarily need to go out exploring to find them! They can show up in



places like on your windows, front doors or in your garden.

The day will feature a simulated emergency department exercise as well as an opportunity to visit the aged care unit and join the staff, residents and volunteers for lunch and refreshments.

"We have a beautiful, modern facility here in Holbrook, and an incredible team of highly trained staff. We are excited to invite the community to come and see them in action," said Kayla Hill, Facility Manager. The staff will be demonstrating the advanced technology in the emergency department and new models of care available for patients.

"The open day will start in the emergency department where we will simulate an emergency response to showcase the skills of our staff and demonstrate the use of the Remote Medical Consultation Service, a virtual care system that enables us to call on a doctor at any time, day or night," said Kayla.

"We will also demonstrate the new Emergency Care and Treatment (ECAT) protocols that our highly trained staff use to ensure patients start their treatment as soon as possible and spend less time in the emergency department. "No-one plans to end up in the emergency department, but we hope that seeing our team in action, and the technology that we have available, is reassuring for anyone who finds themselves in need of emergency care in the future."

Following the emergency scenario and hospital demonstrations, guests will be able to participate in

tours of the hospital and aged care wing. "We have 22 residents who call our facility home and we are proud of the high standard of care we provide," said Kayla. "It is a warm and friendly environment, with lots of home comforts as well as regular activities and outings."

THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA INFORMATION

Thunderstorm asthma can be very serious for people with asthma and or respiratory conditions. The peak time for thunderstorm asthma is mainly spring but can extend to December during the grass pollen season.

Thunderstorm asthma events are thought to be triggered by an unusual mix of high levels of grass pollen and a certain type of thunderstorm.

During these storms tiny pollen grains from grasses can be swept up in the wind and carried long distances. When exposed to this air, the tiny particles of pollen are breathed deep into your lungs, triggering an asthma flare-up or attack.


