DEMENTIA AWARENESS

Dementia Awareness Week Morning Tea, held on the 19th September, was a great success, with many other community members coming. John welcomed everyone and discussed the aim of our morning tea each month to support people in our community who have Dementia, and their carers and family. John discussed the families' perceptive and the importance of gaining support and the need to be talking about this and the real-life experience and the impact this has on everyone.

Maryanne from the Holbrook Multipurpose Centre, (Harry Jarvis Wing) spoke about the safety aspects of people who are cognitive challenged and the things that people need to be aware of in each room of the house. Also, everyday experience and routines can be more challenging, such as shopping and paying for things. Communication is a big factor when interacting with people with Dementia, being able to listen and respond to people, emotions and mood swing and the changes to the person you once knew.

It was interesting to watch a video of a lady who has a form of Dementia, to hear her side of the story, and discussion after this was great!

John spoke at Holbrook Rotary meeting on Thursday 17th October and gave an insight about caring for someone with Dementia.

Dementia affects around 2/3rds of people living in our community and learning more about Dementia can help you support them.

PLANT PICK PLATE

I previously mentioned that I brought chickens into my garden as bug control and soil sifters which tasks the girls are performing to high standards. They also deliver daily a delicious golden egg each as a bonus, then follow me into restricted garden areas to work their magic. Unfortunately, we did have a Donny in our flock so consequently Donny became dinner while I was away, the details I prefer not to know. Pleasantly, the girls are happy, calm and settled without a male presence.



The chickens have readied my garden beds just in time as the warmer weather has finally arrived, thus increasing the soil temperature. Its time to plant vegetables as well as a few other gardening tasks.

* Sow seeds directly into the soil of root vegetables, cucurbits, legumes and corn. Maintain a daily spray watering until the seeds shoot and then keep moist.

* Transplant seedlings into well prepared garden beds or tubs, including tomatoes.

* Mulch using any organic material you have, straw, compost or newspaper once the young plants have grown and also replenish other areas of the garden to retain soil moisture.

* Continue to water pots and plants under house eaves regularly.

* Lemon trees have had bumper crops this past winter and may show signs of nitrogen deficiency displaying yellowing leaves. Apply a dressing of high nitrogen fertiliser, water and mulch.

* If your love is for blue Hydrangea blooms, apply a generous amount of Sulphur powder to the soil and water in thoroughly.

* Make fruit fly baits and hang on fruit trees and near your tomato plantings. There are many homemade recipes available using plastic bottles and items in your pantry.
