AUSTRALIA DAY AMBASSADOR FOR GREATER HUME

Greater Hume Council is thrilled to welcome, Mr James Pittar as Greater Hume's Australia Day Ambassador. James suffers from a genetic disorder called Retinitis Pigmentosa which causes a degeneration of the retina. This disease was diagnosed when James was 16 years old after he suffered from rapidly decreasing vision. He was legally blind at 21 years of age and completely blind by his early 30's.



As a direct result of his declining vision, James focussed his sporting efforts on the fields of swimming and rowing and during the 1990's represented Australia in both these sports as a disabled athlete.

In the mid 1990's James decided to attempt the English Channel after meeting the inspirational Australian swimmer Des Renford and was successful on his first attempt in 1998. He then went on to successfully complete some of the most difficult marathon swims in the world over the next ten years including the Manhattan Island Marathon Swim, The Strait of Gibraltar, New Zealand's Cook Strait and the Catalina Channel. James became the first Australian to complete the Triple Crown of Open water swimming (by completing the English Channel, Manhattan Island marathon swim and the Catalina Channel). In the process had completed an open water swim in every continent excluding Antarctica in 925 days. In 2010, his accomplishments were recognised when he was inducted into the International Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame.

In 2011, James completed a 12km swim from Malabar to Bondi Beach and in 2012 he completed a swim from Collaroy to North Steyne Beach. In 2013 He completed a swim from Long Reef Beach to North Steyne Beach via Shelley Beach Each of these swims was to raise money for the Fred Hollows Foundation & he received The Fred Hollows Foundation Helping Hand Award for his fundraising through his swimming. In August 2013 he was a member of the first ever staged relay swim across the full length of the Bering Strait, roughly 100kms, without wetsuits. There were 66 members from 16 countries. As a member of the Bering Strait swim, James and the other members received the World Open Water Swimming Association Performance of the Year Award.

In 2014 to celebrate the 20th Anniversary of Nelson Mandela becoming President of South Africa, James swam from Robben Island to Blouberg in Cape Town South Africa, without a wetsuit. This was a 7.5km swim in 13° water. He also completed the annual swim for The Fred Hollows Foundation, this time from Dee Why Beach to North Steyne Beach via Shelley Beach.

In addition to his swimming accomplishments, James is the Ambassador for the Rainbow Club; a not for profit organisation which offers swimming lessons for children with disabilities, he is a fundraiser for the Fred Hollows Foundation; which focuses on blindness prevention and indigenous health. His autobiography "Blind Vision" was published in December 2019, and released in 2024 as an Audio Book.

In February of 2020 James as one of 65 swimmers involved in the Relay swim across the length of the Bering Straits. The event and all 65 swimmers were included into the Guinness Book of World Records. A few months later James was inducted into the Australian Marathon Swimming Hall of Fame.



PLANT PICK PLATE

Over the Christmas and New Year break I was messaged a chicken fun fact. As I am such a "Super Cool Chicken Lady", my sister thought this fact would amuse me.

The chicken is the closest living relative to the **T-REX.** I believe it. Observing my chickens, I can see similar characteristics. They strut around on their two strong legs, scratching with the long clawed toes



and extending their long neck high. Wow, I have 3 mini T-REX's in my garden! This revelation lead me to seek out other garden related fun facts.

Did you know that the **Potato** was the first vegetable to be grown in space in 1995 and remains the most popular vegetable worldwide? **Strawberries** are technically not a berry. By definition, berries have seeds on the inside whilst strawberries hold their 200 seeds on the outside and **Tomatoes** are defined as a fruit and also the most popular fruit world wide.

AUSTRALIA DAY RISSOLES

Ingredients:

- 1 lb ground beef
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 cup bread crumbs
- ½ teaspoon dried herbs
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley
- 1 egg , beaten
- Flour

Instructions:

Mix all the ingredients together with the exception of the flour.

Shape into balls and flatten slightly. Rissoles should be about 2 inches (5cm) in diameter for a main course, smaller if they are served as appetizers.

Put the flour in a bag, then add 2 rissoles at a time. Stir gently until rissoles are covered with flour. Shake off excess flour before cooking. Cook on a grill or barbecue about 8 to 10 minutes on each side.




