Local motorbike champion *Jed Fyffe* is on **FIRE**



Since we last brought you the story about Jed Fyffe in August 2022 he has gone from strength to strength. Not only in Australia but Jed's been recently competing all across the globe. In 2023 he brought home 2 Australian Dirt Track Titles, along with this Jed raced the American Flat

Track Grand Championship coming a close second in the 85cc modified Class. This young rising star is taking it to the yanks on their home turf.

Back in Australia, Jed took out the Australian Flat Track Nationals Junior 85cc Championship held over 6 Rounds. He has had a strong season, and his numbers speak for themselves. With 3 poles and 22 race podiums, including 16 race wins, topped off with 5 round

wins, it's safe to say Jed dominated the 2023 season.

In January this year Jed was back in America where he flew to Florida and raced 4 separate Classes at the Winter Throwdown winning 3 of the 4 classes entered.

Our most recent trip to the USA, Jed raced the Flat Track Grand Championships in Du Quoin Illinois where he raced six days in a row alternating between the 250-4 stroke and the 85cc two stroke classes, coming home with 2 Championships in the 85cc Production Class and 85cc Modified Class, also having some solid results and podium finishes in the 250 class.

He has not only been competing but he has been on the podium and winning races and championships across all of these very different disciplines. The level of competition in the US is fierce, so to achieve these results coming from the other side of the world is an amazing feat.

Now back home In Australia our focus will be racing the Junior Lites Class at the first and second Round of Australian Flat Track Nationals to be held at Appin

NSW on the 27th and 28th of July.

The future is indeed looking very bright for this little legend and we are so excited to see his career taking off. We are so proud of the achievements young Jed has made with his riding improving and it's been amazing to watch him grow his skills with determination, hard work and training.

Well done Jed!







A Christmas Carol

Last month, Saint Mary MacKillop College staged an original adaptation of Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol at the wonderful School of Arts hall in Jindera. We ran three shows over the weekend of the 28th and 29th, with each one completely selling out.

Although nowhere near Christmastime, it might have temporarily felt like that time of the year for those who attended. The hall was lavishly adorned in Christmas decorations and all were warmly welcomed by students in period attire serving Christmas treats. Students of our Year 12 class ran a candy bar, where they sold more Christmas goodies, hot chocolates and programs. Outside the hall, beautiful Christmas garlands and lanterns were hanging, along with a sign for Scrooge and Marley's counting house. On each of the doors, a plaque warned attendants that there was to be "No begging, no carolling and no merriment", in keeping with the 'bah humbug' theme of the play.

The interior scenes were sparser by comparison, but were effective nonetheless. Our capable stagehands had to swiftly manage bringing on and off beds, dining tables, desks, chairs, fireplaces, a tombstone and many items besides. For those familiar with the space in the wings of this stage, I think you'll agree this was an impressive feat!

The production had a substantial cast size, with over 30 students involved. We had some as young as Year 2; several in who are doing their HSC – including the star of the show, Xavier Wall, who did a magnificent job playing Ebenezer Scrooge – and everything in between. One of the great things about this show was the family-like bond that formed between the cast, irrespective of ages. They had been rehearsing twice a week since March, which was a real commitment. In the actual performances, each of them did a phenomenal job and will no doubt cherish this experience for many years to come.



Jindera Tennis Club (JTC) recently conducted its AGM and elected its committee for the 2024-25 tennis season. Jindera News put some questions to new **President Warwick Horsfall** as a means of providing readers with some background information relating to the JTC and how the competition works.

Can you tell us a little about the history of the JTC?

Legend has it that a tennis club was *first formed in Jindera in 1897, some 127 years ago*. This was just 28 years after Jindera was formally gazetted as a town. There is a record of the JTC first joining the Hume Tennis Association competition in 1927 as a foundation member. Up until 1977 the tennis courts were located where the current netball courts are at the opposite end of the Jindera Recreation Reserve. Six courts were initially constructed at the current site and soon followed by a further four and then two more to make a total of 12 courts.

The new courts instigated a period of strong growth for the JTC with competitions played on weekends and weekdays. Teams were also entered in the Albury Tennis Association competition and numerous tournaments were conducted. Coaching was available to members and many social events were conducted. The initial six 'top' courts were first provided with a synthetic surface in 1996 and the 'bottom' six courts 10 years later. Lighting has been recently upgraded to provide a 'fit-for-purpose' environment for night tennis.

Club records are sparse, particular prior to the 1990's. How many pennants and trophies the club has won over the 127 years is a mystery. One task I have set myself is to round up as much of the history surrounding the club as I can. So, if anyone reading this is aware of a box of 'old stuff' somewhere, or any information at all relating to the club, please let me know.

What competition does the JTC play in?



The JTC still plays in the Hume Country Tennis Association (HCTA). The HCTA consists of community based tennis clubs associated with Jindera, Bungowannah, Howlong, Brocklesby, Burrumbuttock, Walla Walla, Pleasant Hills, Culcairn, Holbrook, Henty and Table Top. The number of teams fielded by each club varies depending on how many players are at their disposal. Jindera is the largest club in the HCTA and has at times entered up to 10 teams.

There are currently seven sections in the competition with the top section catering for the best players and the lower sections providing for juniors starting out on their tennis journey. The middle sections are the most popular and could be described as competitive social tennis. This is where the *has-beens* and *coodabeens* lurk along with the up and coming juniors. This range of teams enables the club to provide for all standards of tennis players.

What is the format of the competition?

The HCTA season generally runs from October following the school holidays through to mid - December when there is a break. The competition resumes later in January and runs through to finals in March. The Grand Final for all sections is played at Jindera on the same



day. Competition is on Saturday afternoons commencing at 1.30pm and undertaken on a home-and-away basis i.e. our teams play every second week at the Jindera courts.

Teams consist of four females and four males and all matches are played in a doubles format. Each player plays four separate sets (each first to six games); three as the same sex and one as mixed doubles. The winning team is the one that has won the most games on the day. The top four teams in each section at the end of the season then play off in the finals.

Matches are cancelled when the temperature is forecast to exceed 38 degrees and also if it is raining or the courts are too wet. So, you don't have to play in extreme conditions.

What forms of membership are available?

The JTC has various forms of membership to try and cater for everyone's needs. These include adult, junior, family and social membership. Last season the membership fees for each category were \$60, \$30, \$140 and \$50 respectively, if paid as part of an early bird deal. Members have 24/7 access to the courts for unlimited tennis at no cost. Non-members can hire the courts on a one-off basis.

Do members have to join a team?

If readers are interested in tennis but not sure as to what joining the JTC means, please reach out to me so that I can explain where you might fit in. Don't be put off by fear of having to commit to playing. Members don't have to commit to a team and even being a member of a team does not mean you are expected to play every weekend during the season. Teams are structured so there are more players than required for each weekend. This allows for team members to have some weekends off when they need to. How much you want to play depends entirely on you by negotiation with your team coordinator.

Finally, who should readers contact if they are interested in joining the JTC?

If in reading the above someone is interested in joining the JTC they should contact me on **04 1231 4617** in the first instance. Likewise, if readers just want to find out more about club. If they are interested in joining a team they should contact me by 16 August. This step is just an expression of interest to assist in determining how many players the club might have for the upcoming season. There is no obligation by doing this.



The last few months have been trying with the weather not being in the anglers favour.




