



Headlines and Happenings for December



She gave strategies for when a situation might need expertise beyond us. Interactive exercises highlighted boundaries and the ease with which we can misinterpret situations. She also highlighted the importance of self-care giving many practical ways that we can be mindful to take better care of ourselves.

We are grateful to Bjelkie to have given her time to prepare a session especially for us and to take the morning out of her workday to present to us, free of charge. 



KAIDEN ELEY'S brave fight against a rare condition - Neurofibromatosis (NF)

Kaiden Eley's mum, Tegan is shining a light on a hidden condition. 7 year old Kaiden may seem like any other growing child at first glance, but he faces a unique challenge.

A rare genetic condition, little understood by health professionals and even less by the public, threatens to cut his young life short. Tegan tells Jindera News she was "shocked" and "confused" when a doctor finally gave the diagnosis of **Neurofibromatosis** commonly called NF.

The rare genetic condition causes tumours to form in the brain, spinal cord and nerves. It varies person to person; Kaiden has neurofibromatosis type one, which can cause bone deformities, learning disabilities and dangerous high blood pressure.

A ccording to the Children's Tumour Foundation (CTF), every THREE days a child is born with neurofibromatosis (NF) in Australia. The Children's Tumour Foundation is the leading charity supporting more than 13,000 people across Australia, impacted by this rare genetic condition, neurofibromatosis. There is no cure and treatment options are limited.

With NF impacting their family directly, Tegan says, "when Kaiden was younger, we never thought anything was wrong. Yes, his head was slightly larger than average. Yes, he had birth marks and yes, his speech was impacted and slightly slower. But we followed up with health professionals and nothing was a miss, plus every child develops at their own rate and no red flags had occurred."

Then Covid happened with appointments being pushed back or not occurring and they were being asked to ring back to check on Covid rules. It wasn't until August of 2022 that a new paediatrician (that they finally got to see after 2 years) noticed that Kaiden could have this condition. After she checked what she needed to he was very quickly diagnosed.

It was all a blur when they found out, with their gorgeous boy being just 5 years old at the time. Lots of appointments and trips to Melbourne are now normal for the Eley family.

They found the CTF in June of 2023 and they have been a great lifeline being able to provide resources and network with other families as it is especially isolating being in regional NSW.

Tegan tells us "a lot of people in the health industry had never heard of NF or knew very little about it, so finding health professional's has been hard. We were questioned on our choices or just brushed off, but simple things as a headache or bumps on his skin can have serious health impacts on Kaiden".

A aiden recently had his first MRI after months of waiting and figuring out whether to have it locally or in Melbourne - this became a very good eye opener to Tegan about how parents must continue to fight to get children seen and heard in the health area. Tegan continues "if I wasn't doing the communicating, he would have fallen through the cracks as the health sector wasn't communicating to me around questions I had".

A aiden is actually just about to turn 8 and looking at

him you'd think he's just like other little boys his age but on the inside this could be another matter. At the moment he doesn't seem to have major issues but this could easily change at any time and this continue for the rest of his life as there is no cure.

JINDERA BUSH FIRE BRICADE

CAN WE FIT

The fire season is underway, and the weather has been kind to us so far. The rain we have been experiencing has definitely helped with the growth of our gardens. We ask that you please remember that our trucks are big, and we need space to be able to get through your gates and down driveways. Our large tankers need 4 metres height clearance (all the way down your driveway) and gates need to be at least 3.0 to 3.5 metres wide for us to get into your property.

TOTAL FIRE BAN

With the forecast temperatures we have coming, it is important to understand what you can and cannot do when a Total Fire Ban is

declared. During a Total Fire Ban you cannot light, maintain, or use a fire in the open, or to carry out any activity in the open that causes, or is likely to cause, a fire. General purpose hot works (such as welding, grinding or gas cutting, or any activity that produces a spark or flame) are not to be done in the open.

Total Fire Bans are declared on days when the weather is very hot, dry, and windy. These are usually on days when the fire danger rating is Extreme or Catastrophic. They reduce the risk of fires damaging or destroying life, property, and the environment. The NSW RFS Commissioner may declare a **Total Fire Ban** the afternoon before a high-risk day. However, a Total Fire Ban may be issued on the actual day if weather conditions get worse. A Total Fire Ban usually starts at midnight and lasts for 24 hours.

Can I use an electric barbeque? YES - You can use an electric barbeque for cooking as long as it is under the direct control of a responsible adult, who is present at all times while it is operating, and no combustible material is allowed within two metres at any

Can I use a gas barbeque? YES - You can use a gas barbeque under the following conditions: It is under the direct control of a responsible adult, who is present at all times while it is operating; No combustible material is allowed within two metres at any time it is operating; You

have an immediate and continuous supply of water; and the barbeque is within 20 metres of a permanent private dwelling such as a home; or the barbeque is within a designated picnic area and the appliance is approved by Council, National Parks or State Forest.

Can I use a barbeque or pizza oven which burns solid fuel (e.g. wood, charcoal, or heat beads)? NO - A barbeque or wood fire pizza oven which uses solid fuel, such as wood, charcoal, or heat beads, cannot be used outside during a Total Fire Ban.

On a **Total Fire Ban Day**, we strongly recommend you reconsider activities such as using a tractor or slashing, to help reduce the chance of a fire starting on your property. Under certain conditions, the NSW RFS may issue a *Harvest Safety Alert*.

If you have a fire permit they are suspended on days of Total Fire Ban. Permits may resume after the Total Fire Ban is lifted, as long as the permit has not expired.

Greater Hume Council - November Meeting

- A tender was accepted for the **Dight Street Drainage** and **Reconstruction**. Work will commence in the New Year.
- Council approved the **lodging of applications** for funding under the NSW Active Transport Program to enable a **shared path** to be constructed along Drumwood Road.
- Funding for the **carpark works** including drainage, shared path and fencing was approved as Stage 1 at the Jindera **Adventure Playground**. Tenders will be called for as soon as practical.
- Council is to carry out a **review of the current projects** in Councils Section 7.12 Plan and following consideration and public consultation by Council readvertise a revised 7.12 Plan project program that allocates funds for Stage 2 of the **carpark project** as a priority project instead of a **dog park** at the Recreation Reserve which will then be placed as a future project in a different location.
- * Residents who travel along **Hueske Rd** are happy to see that Essential Energy have started preparation for the installation of **street lighting** at the intersection of Hueske Rd and Urana Rd.
- * Keep a look out for **RED BOWS** on the large trees in the main block.
- * Stages 1-3 of the Adventure **Playground Shade Sails** have been **installed** which look great. Please see the list **below** which recognizes the community members and businesses who contributed to the total cost. There is one section to go which comprises three small sails. Hopefully funds will become available soon. Donations are always welcome!
- * Don't forget to register your house for the **Christmas Lights** (see page 13) competition. Forms are available at IGA, the Op Shop and Swimming Pool.
- * Police Chief Inspector Scott Russell met with me to discuss **community concerns** mentioned in an email to the Albury **Police Station** regarding incidents in Jindera which have been occurring and the lack of a police presence. He was interested to hear of the different issues people have faced and will be checking in on a regular basis. His main advice is to keep on **reporting any problems** that arise regardless of how insignificant they seem. This allows the police to build up a picture of what is happening and helps them in their planning. Hopefully there will be a more visible presence as cars which are going out from Albury to other Greater Hume towns do a drive through and around Jindera. Remember....*REPORT REPORT REPORT*!





Exploring the Magic of Materials: A Sweet Scientific Adventure!

In Science this term, the Goannas and Wallabies classes have been delving into the fascinating world of materials, specifically focusing on the Material World. Our exploration has centred around the properties of solids and liquids, and we have engaged in a series of hands-on experiments to observe how various materials can change states. So far, our exciting experiments have included creating Oobleck from cornflour and water, discovering the fastest technique to release gummy bears from ice cubes, and melting solid chocolate back into liquid before transforming it into solid chocolate once again - if we can resist the temptation to eat it too soon! This week, we embarked on a experiment involving the effects of salt-saturated water, sugar-saturated water, and tap water on gummy bears. The students eagerly made predictions and monitored the changes in the gummy bear sizes throughout the day, fostering a sense of curiosity and scientific inquiry.















Discovering History: An Enriching Adventure at Jindera Museum

On a delightful school excursion, our infants visited the Jindera Museum, where they were immersed in a rich tapestry of local history and culture. The children explored various exhibits showcasing artefacts from the past, engaging their curious minds as they learned about the significance of the region's heritage. With interactive displays and hands-on activities, the visit encouraged exploration and discovery, allowing the little ones to connect with the stories of those who came before them. The friendly museum staff provided insightful guidance, making the experience both educational and enjoyable. Overall, the trip to Jindera Museum was a wonderful opportunity for our infants to broaden their understanding of the world around them while fostering a sense of community and appreciation for history.





















The previous plans for a Multi-Purpose Stadium for Jindera have now taken a different direction in that the relatively new committee has begun discussions with the Jindera Football/Netball Club to come together on a joint venture to build a Community Centre, rather than a hall or stadium.

The original Jindera Multi-Purpose Stadium Committee needs to be acknowledged for the planning and fundraising they have done since 2002, and their continual promotion of the initial stadium concept, in conjunction with Council staff and individual Councillors.

The new Community Centre concept opens the options to a different type of centre that can be utilised by the Football Club as well as other community groups. By working towards a large multi-use building rather than an additional new building, there will be less upkeep for Council and the community as a whole. The new building will also replace and consolidate existing structures around the oval.



The new concept plans will be on display at the Jindera Hub from February 1 next year, with a planned <u>Community Meeting</u> to be held at the Hub on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 25</u> for residents to further view the concept plans and discuss with the Committee - feedback will be most welcome.

Moving forward, there is still a concerted effort required to raise more funds to prove to the Council that Jindera is serious about a new community centre, with the need also to prove that the wider community, and outside entities, will utilise the new centre.

In addition, the project will necessitate the application for grant money, however, this will not be an option until the community can present concept plans and raise enough funds to start the project moving.

Please support the committee as they strive to make this dream a reality, providing the community with an impressive facility which can be utilised by many groups for a myriad of regular activities, events and functions.

Farrer MP Sussan Ley has welcomed a decision by Telstra to **install 4g/5g antennas** at Jindera's Recreation Reserve before the end of the year.

Ms Ley launched a town-wide petition last month stepping up pressure on the telco after continuing complaints of mobile dropouts and signal capacity issues surrounding the town. The upgrade will shift Telstra phone cells from a smaller tower in the town centre – co-locating on a taller Optus tower - significantly boosting coverage around Jindera and Glenellen as well as parts of Ettamogah & Bungowannah.

Telstra has confirmed transmission fibre work is scheduled from early next month, with a completion date of 23 December, barring unforeseen delays. "It's a welcome Christmas present to this community who have waited far too long to have this mobile service upgraded", Ms Ley said.

"Jindera is one of the **border's fastest growing** areas, increasing in population by about four percent every year.

"To attract people to regional areas you need good health facilities, you need quality education options, BUT you also need an ability to communicate.

"An estimated delay of up to two years – the previous timeframe that was offered by Telstra, was completely unacceptable. Bringing this project forward is a good move; it's the right move."

Optus and NBN installed towers at Jindera's Recreation Reserve a number of years ago, with NBN announcing a high-speed wireless option from the site (up to 400mbps download speeds) from next month.

Sussan Ley speaks to parliament against local Racism.

I have a message from my electorate of Farrer: *those who try to divide us will only make us stronger*.

On 12 October, up to 50 Neo-Nazis dressed in black with faces covered converged at Corowa. The location choice was no coincidence; Corowa is the birthplace of Australia's federation. The people's convention of 1893 united this nation's divided colonies to work as one country.

These men, the National Socialist Network, sought support for a publicity stunt. They failed miserably. Corowa rebuked the mob, demanding they leave town immediately. When I visited the next day, the message was clear from the mayor, business and community leaders and everyday citizens: your views are not welcome in our town - not now and not ever. It also emerged that the group had assembled at Albury's war memorial, alone on a cold midwinter evening, preaching white supremacy rubbish to themselves. That's where these views will be delivered, disappearing into the void of a dark night. You might meet in secret or sink into backroom social media sites, but as soon as you come out of the dark, you will be rejected.

Failing to find support in our cities? If you think there's a base for you in rural Australia, think again. Corowa and the Albury region have spoken loudly —those who try and divide us only make us stronger.




