JINDERA BUSH FIRE BRIGADE

BUSH FIRE AWARE - BUSH FIRE SURVIVAL

At this time of year, we need to be constantly **bush fire** aware. We have seen the devastation the fires in Victoria and



California caused. It is important our household Bush Fire Survival plans are developed and discussed with everyone that lives in our homes. We all need to have thought through what we would do if a fire impacted the township of Jindera or our properties. As we have seen in California, you don't only need to live in the bush to have your home destroyed.

Fire Danger Rating

To assist in preventing this devastation, we need to ensure our properties are very well prepared and we are aware of what the **fire danger rating** for the day is (please check our **Electronic Display Signs** at the **Jindera Station**), and what you need to be prepared to do if a fire starts in our area. With our summer continuing with some hot dry weather, our environment is **drying out quickly**. The Jindera brigade is a member of the Southern Border Team (SBT) which includes Greater Hume Shire, Albury City, Federation and Berrigan Councils. The council areas are divided into eight groups. The Jindera brigade is part of group 4, along with Bungowannah, Burrumbuttock, Walla, Glenellen, Gerogery, Tabletop, Thurgoona, Lavington, and Splitters Creek brigades.

Fire Brigade Captain's Annual Tour

Recently these brigades have undertaken some extra training for their members by touring the local hill areas to check on the conditions. Our **Captain's Annual Tour** was held on the 18th of January (you might have seen a number of fire trucks coming through town). The Jindera Captain, Graham Yensch invited all the Brigades in the SBT Group 4 to join his tour. All ten Brigades in the group were represented with nineteen fire trucks and over seventy-five firefighters. The Captains tour took the group through the hills from Bungowannah through to Jindera and then around the Jindera Gap finishing in the Lavington Brigade area. We greatly appreciate the various landowner's cooperation letting the group through their properties for this fantastic training opportunity.

The key aspect of the tour is to train and hone the skills of our drivers and to increase our crews understanding of the level of risk we face if a fire starts in the area.



The dams we passed on the tour are drying out, so we also need to be increasing our training on how to control fires with limited access to and use of water.

Dry Lightning Strikes - Be Well Prepared

If we were to experience fires like we have seen in Victoria we may only be able to move to property protection in the area. Many of these fires are caused by **dry lightning strikes** which are unpredictable. This is why you need to ensure your **properties are well prepared**, and if you have determined in your Bush Fire Survival Plan to stay and defend your property, that you are able to do this.

Number of and Use of Fire Trucks

One of the main questions we are often asked is are there **enough fire trucks** in the area to protect every/my house. We are lucky in the SBT Group 4 area with the number of trucks and crews we have. However, we can not always have a fire truck at every property. We are dispatched to the area of highest risk or potential level of Bushfire impact in the area. This means we may drive past your property with lights and sirens going to protect other properties and to stop the spread of the fire where we can.

Graham (Jindera Captain) says *thank you* to everyone in the local area for their support of the brigade and by the level of property preparedness he sees in many circumstances, but there is always room for improvement. If your Bush Fire Survival Plan is to leave, **please go early**.

On a day of extreme or CATASTROPHIC FIRE DANGER RATING please leave as early as you can.

The brigade is always looking for **new members**. Captain Graham says "Training, boots and fire fighting apparel will be provided to new members. Once your basic training is completed, you can start attending fire calls, and it is up to you how much time you give to the community.

This change is part of the reforms being made following the Aged Care Royal Commission findings. New Subdivision in JINDERA STREET gets Approval

At the December Greater Hume Council meeting, the proposed development of **20 lots along Jindera Street** was **passed unanimously**. This is the first stage of development of the 24 hectares owned by Jindera Lutheran Church, and was first identified in the 1980's as the direction in which Jindera should grow. With the majority of lots around 900 sq. metres in this stage, and few lots of this size now available in Jindera, we expect considerable interest when they are released.

We have been endeavouring to get this project under way since 2017, but the environmental legislation bought in at the same time by NSW Government has created significant barriers to what should have been a straight forward project. An initial proposed upgrade of Jindera Street with kerbing and guttering, and a footpath cannot be undertaken by the developer, which is as a result of this legislation.


The development will create a new street and footpath within the property.

As a result of the project, Council has undertaken to construct stage 1 of the flood mitigation works designed in 2021. The flood works will be a collaboration between Council and the Church, but cannot be undertaken without the project proceeding. Residents whose properties have been inundated in recent years should be pleased that work will now commence, and it is hopeful that further stages of the flood mitigation can be carried out as the property is developed.

Whilst some trees will need to be removed, Biodiversity credits have to be purchased through the Scheme, and these credits ensure that similar flora and fauna habitat is preserved in perpetuity in the local area.

Final engineering design and budgeting is currently being undertaken, and it is expected that blocks will be on the market in late 2025.

Solar Lights to be Assessed

The Pioneer Drive solar lights which was a pilot project will be assessed at the end of twelve months to consider effectiveness and comments by community during all weather conditions. A community survey will be coming out in the coming months.

Relocation of Telstra to Optus Tower

The relocation of Telstra (see page 30) to the Optus Tower near the football clubrooms is complete after three years of following up with Telstra. Let's hope that we all see a significant improvement in service.

Future Work at Adventure Playground

Works at the Adventure Playground will commence shortly and it is planned to be completed by April/Easter. This includes the footpath, dump point, fencing, shade and tree planting.



Hueske Rd Intersection Street Lights

Although the Hueske Rd intersection street lights have been installed they haven't been switched on due to all Essential Energy works are impacted by pay disputes etc. It could be weeks or months unfortunately.

Dight Street Works

The work on Dight Street will be completed by the end of March. The trenching, kerb and gutter should be finished in the next few weeks to allow the road to be open at the start and end of school days to let school buses through. The new footpath is nearly completed.

Thank you for everyone's patience while these important, overdue works are completed.

Sealing of the carpark at the northern side of the swimming pool and the provision of sealed parking on Dight Street is also included in the works.

We hope the work will be accomplished in 2 weeks starting on 3rd February.



The Henty/Culcairn Probus Club met at Henty on Wednesday 8 January 2025.

Our president Warren welcomed us and our two visitors Vivien and Neil.

Alison Schuster was our five minute speaker and told us of growing up on a farm with four older brothers.

Alison loved sports. The family built tennis courts, and there were tennis parties and singing around the pianola after tea. She remembers dances, and being able to see the birds and wild flowers in the swamp. Warren presented Alison with our Probus pen as a thankyou token for sharing her happy memories.

After morning tea we had music and singing and we can now sing about Kookaburra living in an old gum tree, as a round.

Our main speaker was Daniel Hore, who came with young people from the NDIS support service, Next Step, with whom he works. Daniel is grandson of our member Alice Hore. Daniel has been to the base camp at Mount Everest. He turned a boyhood dream into a real adventure. The physical training involved three times per week with back pack loaded, walking at The Rock for eight months. We learned of the pre organising of evening meals at tea houses, mainly vegetarian meals, sleeping bags were a necessity, and water had to be carried, and then there was learning to breathe the mountain air. We saw photos of the little airport and the amazing mountains, the people carrying enormous loads and the swing bridges where working yaks had priority.

Daniel noted the caring and helping nature of the people and the way children valued education. School had a dirt floor with perhaps two hours of lessons, and then back to work. The walking seemed to be about ten kilometres per day, to the next tea house, and past Numchee Village, a Market town. The highest place of worship is Den Bo Che, where there were less trees and a need to drink six litres of water per day or succumb to altitude sickness. Potatoes were grown on farms and there were still seven or eight days of walking to get to the Everest base camp. There has been a recycling business established to clean up after tourists and employ Nepalese people. For Daniel this trip to Everest guided by San Deep, has been amazing, and we have shared the terror of plane flight in the mountains and the learning to control body temperature and getting to the base camp to see 50 to 60 people in various stages of coping with the altitude. The base camp was around minus 25degrees and very easy to get frost bite. The ground was rocky and there is a memorial site for people who died on climbs. Back at the airport before the trip home, Daniel had hot chocolate to celebrate and a need to be involved in helping people in his own community. Now Daniel wants to do walks in Australia before perhaps going back to Nepal.

Richard presented Daniel with our token of appreciation, the Probus pen.

Our next meeting is to be **Wednesday February 12th** at **Culcairn**. Our speaker is to be a surprise for us all. Hope you will join us.

The federal MP stepped up pressure on Telstra last year after many continual complaints of dropouts and signal capacity issues coming from residents and businesses living and working in one of the border's fastest growing communities.

It emerged that Telstra had regulatory approvals in place to move from a 20m tower in the Jindera town centre to the Recreation Reserve but would only give an estimated works timetable pushed out to 2026.

A community meeting followed by a petition organised by Ms Ley convinced Telstra to set a date for the transfer which is now confirmed for next week. "The original timeframe was simply not good enough. Even now we're a month later than hoped but I guess we're almost there, Ms Ley said. "This growth area northwest of Albury is increasing in population by around 4% pa and it is vital communication needs keep up with the demand.

So, well done to the Jindera community, led by local Greater Hume councillor Jenny O'Neill, for helping push this along - I'm hoping the wait is worth it, particularly for customers outside of town including Glenellen and parts of Ettamogah & Bungowannah."

The Telstra transfer comes as NBN confirmed its high-speed upgrade to the fixed wireless network serving Jindera was completed last month.



Telstra relocating mobile base station in Jindera



Telstra will be relocating its mobile base station at Jindera to bring a better 4G and 5G user experience and improved coverage to the community. The site will move from the existing 15m structure on Urana Street to a 30m structure located in Jindera Recreation Reserve. Mobile services in the area will be temporarily affected while the relocation works are carried out. Telstra Media contact: media@team.telstra.com

The Telstra Regional General Manager Chris Taylor has said "We know how important mobile connectivity is for Australians, whether you're in the city or the country. As data use over our mobile network continues to grow, adding extra 4G and 5G capacity to our mobile site in the area is a major mobile milestone. Relocating our equipment onto a taller structure will deliver broader coverage to the area. The upgrade means faster downloads, smoother streaming and less congestion."

He also noted "While disruption is required during the relocation work, we'll only be switching off the site when we need to and will have it back online at the new location and working better than ever as quickly as possible."

Temporary disruptions

Telstra mobile customers will receive texts advising of the upcoming work.

Landline services, NBN internet services, and mobile coverage from other providers will not be impacted.

The site will need to be **switched off** during the following periods:

Up to 8 hours per day between 7am and 7pm from Tuesday 28 January to Saturday 1 February 2025


Tips for improving connectivity while works are underway
