Jindera local Archie McDonald *Beats the World!*

Following on from our story 'Cheeky Speed Freak' in the September 2021 edition.....

We left the adventure as our local lovable larrikan, Archie McDonald, had been signed with Italian team ProGP Racing in 2021 and was competing the Italian Championship around Europe and living in Italy.

Archie sustained a broken leg early in the season that saw him miss the opening round. But his *'never give up'* attitude soon saw him bounce back, racking up podiums and race wins and finishing in the top 7.

He made the move from the ProGP team to Spanish team MRE Talent, and progressed to competing in the European R3 Cup in 2022.

This brought him to establish accommodation in Mallorca, Spain, and continue the rigorous training regime that is required by an athlete of this elite standard.

In 2023, after a gentle nudge from his Coach, Archie stepped up a level and contested the 2023 FIM JuniorGP Superstock 600 cc. He clocked up good points in every single round, which saw him claim fifth overall in the championship.

Home for Christmas 2023.... Scott (*Dad*) bought a bike for Archie to compete in the Summer Night Series in Sydney. This was a short series of races held over December and January, under lights. It was at one of these race meetings that Scott was approached by Robbie Bolger from Stop and Seal Racing, seeking to have Archie on their team in Australia.

This merger has seen Archie back in the Australian Superbike (ASBK) paddock again in 2024, but now in the 600cc class. He has again proven to be a force to be reckoned with and currently sits in 5th place overall in the ASBK.

Archie is living the life of an elite sportsperson, travelling and competing between the Australian Supersport, where he is based here locally with his family, and the FIM JuniorGP Superstock 600 Championships where his base is still Mallorca, Spain... and having just turned 18 years of age.



Archie's Dad, Scott, says his head is spinning. He is in awe of his son's incredible talent and drive, and his ability to pull the magic out of the hat! He himself, continues to do the same in full support of his Son's goals, which I know are shared and creates a strong bond between them.

A highlight and huge personal achievement for Archie in the recent Round 4 of the FIM JuniorGP Superstock 600 cc, raced in Portugal (23rd June 2024), was to make first ever **Pole position**, on his **18th Birthday** no less, and to convert that to his first ever win in this class, putting him in 6th place overall. It's a race worth watching, as it showcases the focus and sheer determination that this young man brings to the sport.



FIM competition takes a break now for a couple of months. Meanwhile, Archie will compete at Morgan Park Raceway, QLD Jul 12-14 and Phillip Island GP Circuit, VIC Sept 7-8. Then he's back to Spain for FIM Round 5 on 15th September (continued - page 10).

What is the biggest cause of house fires in Australia?

Kitchen. The most common place in the home where fires start is the kitchen. Many kitchen fires are caused by **cooking that has been left unattended**. Others are caused by electrical faults and flammable items like paper towels and curtains that are too close to sources of heat like the stove or toaster.

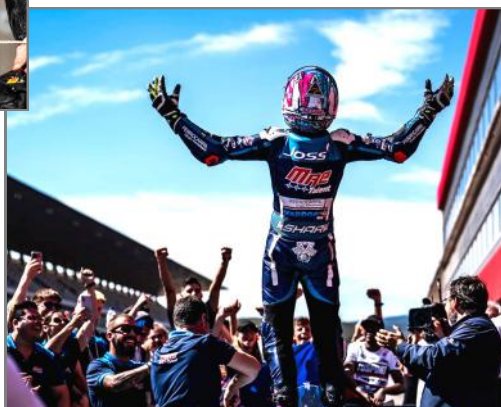

Amanda Lieschke has offered her time to come and show our Little Saints children “where food comes from.” This is a great passion of Amanda’s, and she isn’t afraid to get her hands dirty with the children and show them this important factor of life. Amanda has kept this experience realistic and child-led as she listens to their voices and guides their learning.

During this time, there was lots of conversation about where they lived, farms, how the soil “is like chocolate for the plants”, and what they are planting and what will grow.

We have started with planting beans and small flowers as it is cold outside. The children will continue to care for their new plants in the coming weeks and watch the amazing factor of growing your food.

We cannot wait to see this program continue for our children.



Cooking

We have had a lot of birthdays at Little Saints and the way we like to celebrate is by cooking cakes together as a community and sharing. Parents have been invited to bring cake mixes in for us to explore the benefits of cooking as this encourages children's thinking, problem-solving, and creativity. It also allows children to use their knowledge and apply it by counting, measuring, following a sequence, following directions, and cause and effect.



Puzzles

As the weather is getting colder, some of our children have engaged in play inside. Our main interest is puzzles. With one piece at a time, our children unlock their problem - solving skills. Puzzles allow children to develop spatial awareness, and social skills as they work together, and language skills as they describe the pieces they are looking at. Each time they solve a puzzle, this boosts their confidence, and children begin to learn to enjoy the process rather than the result. Igniting their curiosity to try again.

- **Speed limit changes**

Transport NSW has carried out a review of the speed zone on **Drumwood Rd, Walla Rd and Urana Rd** with the following changes to be made:

1. The existing 80 km/h zone be reduced to 60 km/h on Drummond Rd between Walla Rd and Lindner Road: increasing travel time by approximately 30 seconds.
2. The existing 100 km/h zone be reduced to 60 km/h on Walla Rd, from the intersection of Urana Rd increasing travel time by approximately 19 seconds.

Within two weeks prior to the implementation of the changes, the community will be informed by media release.

This past month our **Wicker Workshop, Twining Vines** into wreaths and baskets was a great success. Two groups of



women gathered at the old Police House to practice the art of twining vines, and then in the case of the wreaths, decorate them with a lovely collection of native fresh and dried pieces. Basket weaving, although a little more complicated,



produced some beautiful outcomes, with a couple of ladies working diligently to produce two fabulous creations. The weather on the afternoon was kind and the groups were able to work outside, which is far more conducive with writhing vine tails. Thank-you Alison for the great idea and Zahira for the assistance on the day.

The museum has been busy with groups this month, from retirement villages and caravan clubs to several schools. The caravan club, with members from a wide area, spent a Saturday morning with us, which was very entertaining with stories of their travels. Schools enjoy the museum as it provides an enclosed space and a wonderful opportunity for students to step back into the lives of people from the past.

It offers a look at how people with different levels of wealth lived, as well as providing an opportunity for students to think about the things we now have to make our lives easier or rather, the things they didn't have in the past, and what that meant for their everyday lives. The museum is not like most museums that present things in glass cases, it feels in many instances, like the people who lived there have just stepped out.

Children often think the museum is a movie set. For larger school groups they have an opportunity to spend some time playing old-fashioned games as well as exploring some of the challenges of life without every 'mod-con'. Schools from across the district visit the museum and sometimes come from further afield like Wagga and Corowa. We believe it is a great place for children to learn invaluable lessons about their past.

This week we have introduced some 'people' into our exhibits, which we think enhances the spaces and provides another perspective. Come take a look and see what you think.

We are also looking to erect another machinery space as we may have the opportunity to acquire a **Tiger Moth** plane in the future and we will need a place in which to restore it. We also need to house some of our machinery that has been out in the weather far too long and the wonderful chaff cutter acquired at the Granite Hill clearing sale needs to also be under cover. This will then open up the section of the museum where the dam was once found; now filled in and compacted, it is time to start placing the collection in this space. This extra space will also prove beneficial for our Forgotten Trades Day to be held again in February next year.



Several of our crew have been working diligently on making lanterns for the **Lantern Walk** to be held at the start of next month and for display at our **Illuminate Our Heritage**, (see advert page 11) a sound and light show to be held at the museum from the **2nd to 4th August**. This sound and light show will feature old film footage, musicians, bush poets and a flame thrower. Food and beverage will also be available for purchase over the three nights the show will run.



The **Lantern Walk** is a **FREE EVENT** on **Saturday 3rd August** and we hope to encourage community participation in the Walk. The schools have been approached to engage the students to make lanterns to carry in the Walk. The museum will also hold two lantern making workshops for people to make their own lanterns to carry on the walk (see advertisements - page 19 opposite).

The Lantern Walk procession, with music and singing, will leave the museum at **5.30pm**, moving north along **Urana St** from the museum to the IGA corner, cross Urana St and travel south to the **Village Green** where the Jindera Theatrical Group will perform a re-enactment of the story of **St. Martin** from whose kindness the walk has evolved.



Pretzels, glühwein and apple juice will be available at the Village Green on conclusion of the walk. This is a story of kindness and good will and we hope will become a yearly community event for Jindera.

Term 2 is coming to a close and we have had an amazing term of learning, exploring and meeting new people within our local Community.

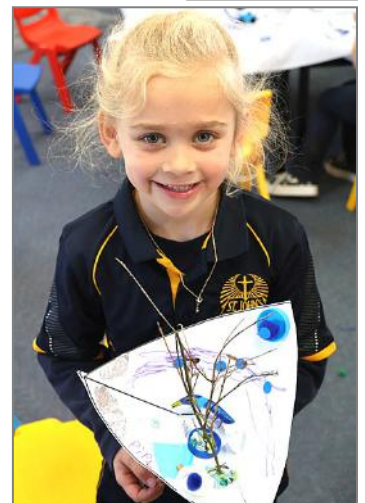
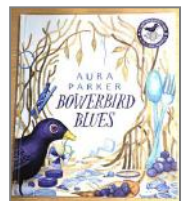
Student Leadership

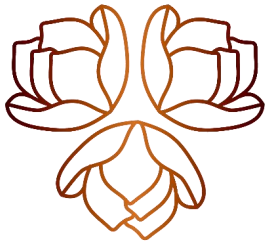

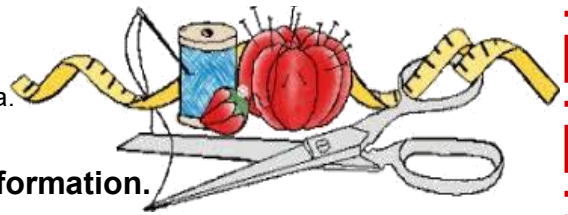

We thanked Steve for sharing his story and Warren presented our token of gratitude, the Probus pen.

Yvonne told us of **959 beanies** on display at the **Henty Art Gallery** and more arriving still, and these are to go to Sydney and the Seafarers Mission with our speaker after the August meeting.

We have learned words and actions to 'Home Among the Gum Trees' and have been shown how pieces of coloured plastic tubing can play three blind mice.

After Neil Parker presented Steve with our Probus pen, Steve joined our pianist Joyce to play the Probus song, very special to us all.

Our **next meeting** is for **July, Wednesday 10th, 9.30am** for 10.00am at **Henty Library**, where we are hoping for a guided tour of the rejuvenated library and some Australian films from the archives.

A lunch of fish and chips will be delivered. We love to have guests and hope you can come along and join us too.

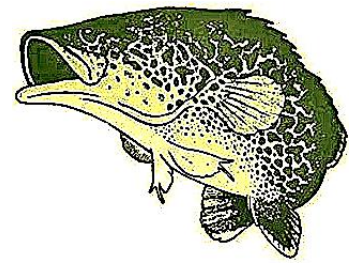

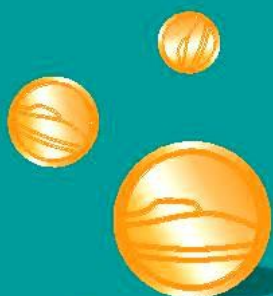
