

# JINDERA RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

Our Bush fire Danger period has now started and will run until the 31<sup>st</sup> of March 2025 (*it may be extended depending on the weather conditions and the level of bushfire threat*). This means you will need to apply for a permit (now available on-line) and follow the conditions set out on the permit.

You can access detailed information on the NSW RFS website at <a href="https://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/">https://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/</a>

**Fire Permits** are important to make sure that fire is used safely. When you have a permit, it tells you the rules for starting and keeping a fire, and it also informs firefighters when you are burning things on your property. In NSW, there are two firefighting agencies that deal with bush fires and emergencies in specific areas called Rural Fire Districts and Fire Districts.

These groups work together closely to respond to emergencies and support all communities, even if they are in different areas. Depending on where your property is located within these areas, you can get a Fire Permit for free. If your property is in a Rural Fire District, you can get a permit from the RFS (Rural Fire Service). To get a permit from RFS, complete the on-line application form with all the required information.

All permits have standard conditions that are listed on the permit form, such as:

- the permit is to be carried by the permit holder, or another person at all times at the site of the fire.
- the fire must be supervised at all times.
- notifications are given to the RFS, FRNSW if required, and adjoining neighbours at least 24 hours prior to the fire being lit and
- the permit may be varied, cancelled, or suspended, depending on weather conditions.

# BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD 1 November 24 to 31 March 25

However, a permit issuing Officer may add any conditions deemed as necessary. To apply for a fire permit, complete the online application form with all the required information. If in doubt about whether you require a fire permit, or for help to apply for one, contact our local NSW RFS Fire Control Centre on 02 6051 1511.

# Please remember you are still required to notify within 24 hours of lighting the fire.

If you have not reviewed or prepared you bushfire survival plan please use the following link to ensure you are ready <a href="https://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/">https://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/</a> click on the Live Bushfire Ready tile and complete your plan with your family and or everyone who lives in your house.

As the Season develops you may see us at the station a bit more over the coming months. The Brigade is always on the *lookout* for new member's drop-in and have a chat to us if you see us at the station. We have many roles that you can help us with if you do not want to get on a fire truck.

Our **Fire Danger Rating Signs** will be available soon, you need to be aware of what each part the wheel means and what you need to be prepared to do on a **Catastrophic**, **High**, **Moderate**, fire danger rating day, you still need to be aware of the potential for fires when we may not be displaying a rating for the day.

# Glenellen Solar Farm

# Community Update



The Glenellen Solar Farm is located on Ortlip Road, 2km northeast of Jindera and is owned by Global Power Generation Australia (GPG Australia). The Project footprint occupies approximately 263ha of the 398ha site.

The solar farm is a large scale photovoltaic Agri-Solar project of 260 MWdc/200MWac, using approximately 380,000 single axis tracking solar panels, up to 5m high, and up to 60 power conversion units (including inverters and transformers).

The Glenellen Solar Farm will deliver renewable, energy to the national grid, enough to supply over 80,000 average Australian homes per annum and avoid over 385,000 tonnes of CO2.

Mobilisation to site began on 28th August. Since then, there have been a number of activities underway:

- The site compound has been established
- Civil contractors have begun work
- Works underway creating access tracks
- Internal fencing has started
- Initial component deliveries have begun
- Approximately 35 people on site about 50% local



# Community Information Day

A Community Information Day was held in August 2024 at the Jindera Community Hub. This event aimed at informing and engaging the local community was attended by many people from the surrounding area. Attendees could ask questions, share feedback, and discuss any concerns they had. The event also featured displays, brochures, newsletters and company merchandise.

# Community Engagement & Benefit Sharing Plan

In the coming weeks we will be out in your community, meeting with local groups, schools and clubs to learn more about all of them and get some feedback. As part of our Community Engagement & Benefit Sharing Plan for the Glenellen Solar Farm, GPG will establish an annual Community Grant Program that is designed to distribute funds to eligible recipients. The grant program will be managed by a committee made up from local people and GPG representatives. We will be asking for nominations for the committee in coming weeks.

The performance by **Kit** ticked all the boxes in the end and they were proclaimed the winners of the first ever Jindera Battle of the Bands!


Holly and Mick are so thankful to **Sodens Hotel** Albury for providing the major prize of a gig on stage so keep an eye out for their show when it comes around!


















# Jindera Pool News







We were so lucky to have such a great spot at the front to be able to see the show up close. To be able to see your siblings perform (which you have no doubt seen the at-home practice sessions for weeks!) had our class cheering and waving.

Being part of this fosters a connection to our community - not only St Johns - but the wider community of grandparents that came to the show and to the visiting schools that joined us as well. It's also good to be able to model from the older children's performance - that they were nervous, and you can tell but they were brave and tried. That mistakes were made, and they carried on. What a lesson in resilience it was!



# The Art of Weaving

Some Little Saints Friends provided the service with some grape vines. After some reflection as to how we will utilise this material, the idea came from a birds nest coming into our service and the children exploring how it was made. It started this with a few children. Over the morning children came and went from this space. Contributing to the weave in small parts or long stints. Refining the skill of extend the vine - in - pull - extend - out. The discussion at this space and sharing of knowledge was beautiful. Children taught children. Children were supported by educators if required. This has to be one of our favourite teaching times of 2024. We explored the art of weaving after this and these words rung true for me from a weaving artist "Rooted in ancient traditions, weaving offers not just a creative outlet but also a meditative practice, a balm for the soul in today's fast-paced world". The opportunity to sit in the shade with a small group of children and take time to simply 'be' is often overlooked in its value in preschool. We are in rush often, to finish this task so we can start the next. So, alongside the children teaching children, perhaps in this instance the children also taught me. Slow down and delight in the 'balms for my soul' in places where they find us.






