Our local girl **MONIQUE BLACKIE** is Greater Hume's only Flying Fruit Fly



As a year 3 and 4 student at St Johns Primary School in Jindera, doing cartwheels and handstands in the school yard at lunch times, Monique and her friends would conduct competitions and

Monique laughs at herself and says, "back then I used to be the worst". Since then, with her ongoing success at the Flying Fruit Fly Circus, Monique has learned that anything can be achieved if you put your mind to it.

It was at the age of 8 when Monique discovered circus. After trying dancing and sports, and not finding any activity that she resonated with, she joined the Saturday recreational circus arts class and realised that circus was in her blood. "I remember after my first class, I didn't stop talking about it. I couldn't wait to go back each week as it was so much fun".

In 2019 Monique was loving circus so much that she tried out for Albury Wodonga's Flying Fruit Fly Circus School, Australia's national youth circus and the only full time academic and circus school in the country. "I wanted to better my chances as much as I could to get in, so I enrolled in their parkour class and advanced Night Flies ensemble which meant I attended 4 circus sessions a week. All that hard work really paid off, because I was accepted to join the Fruit Fly Circus School".

Monique left St Johns and her friends and joined the Flying Fruit Fly Circus in 2020. She soon found that her days were full of travel, school, circus training and homework creating very long days, and a challenging week.

Monique leaves home at 7:15am every morning to catch 3 buses to school. She started training at 8:30am several mornings a week. School sometime finished at lunchtime and she then spent several hours on the training floor. The training does not end there, she is also required to train 4 nights a week until 7pm. This makes for a very long day, but she wouldn't have it any other way.

Monique is then expected to do her home work when she gets home like any regular teenager. Monique explains that "the training is intense, and requires a lot of commitment, discipline, hard work, and long hours, but is so worth it".

Monique enjoys different areas of circus with her favourite the Lyra (aerial ring) and she is learning the Roue Cyr (cyr wheel). She often comes home with many bruises after learning new tricks. Monique has made an advert for circus, and has performed on the banks of the Murray for the Morning Show, along with a number of local performances in Albury and Wodonga.

In 2022 Monique was cast in "Girls With Altitude", created by the Flying Fruit Fly Circus in collaboration with political cartoonist Judy Horacek. At the age of 13, Monique was able to travel with the circus around Queensland, NSW, Victoria and central Australia for an 8 week sold out tour. Monique tells us that she managed travelling, remote schooling, rehearsing, performing and still managed to sight see and do a lot of fun activities along the way.

Monique says "We stayed in hotels and I had to learn to live with other people, cooking and doing our own laundry. Being on tour meant we had a job to do, and we needed to be professional". She adds "I can't wait to go on tour again in the future, it is by far the biggest highlight of my time at the Fruities." (Continued on - page 31)





Headlines and Happenings

Thank you to the members who attended the AGM at the Jindera Hub on Sunday 19 May 2024. The members present and proxies have unanimously approved the updated constitution. The following have been elected to RCL:

Summary of the 2023 year

The Treasurer - reported Op Shop sales were up in 2023 which provided funds for Rural Care Link (RCL) for several grants, donations and support to those in need in our area.

\$11,000 in Donations were given which included, \$4,500 to 6 local schools to supply children with breakfast, excursions, uniforms as needed. \$4,500 to the Jindera Public School **swimming program** to set up and implement a program to provide children the opportunity to improve their water fitness and stroke correction. \$1,400.00 sponsorship to some local families for pool season tickets 2023-2024. As part of our core business, we are also supporting the Carers Group, Jindera Community Carols, Anzac Day and Welcome Packs to newcomers to Jindera. The **Village Green up lights** were supported with a RCL donation and use of our banking facility to hold funds to reach the target.

Carer Plus - 21 people attended the Glow Well-being and Mental Health workshop day at no cost to the participants due to the Australia Post Grant and support from RCL for catering for the day.

Necessitous Circumstances (care for those in need) – a further \$4,700 in support given to members of our community for groceries, fuel or help with cleaning & gardening/lawn maintenance. As well as confidential support for people struggling with difficult life circumstances.

Carer Group - very active during the year with a drumming workshop in the Village Green and lunches and morning teas supported by grants and the RCL. The carers group provides invaluable peer support for each other.

The **Jindera News Coordinator** thanked our volunteer editor as well as local businesses and community who support our local newspaper as it continues to succeed and grow. 650 copies are now printed by Conway's Printing each month and over 200 digital email copies are distributed.

The President and Secretary have been busy in 2023 with updating the constitution, reviewing compliance and making a start on reviewing policies and procedures and will continue in this and other community support initiatives in 2024.

Rural Care Link invite people in the community to become a member of this innovative local charity. There are volunteer positions available in the Op-Shop, with people in need (Necessitous Circumstances) and on the committee.

Very soon we hope to go to the Regent Cinema to see “The Way, My Way”, this will be compliments of funding received from Carers NSW. We will follow this up with a coffee and chat in Albury.

Over the coming months I hope to offer our Carer Group Members a chance to discover Yoga, enjoy a pampering session, participate in a photography walk, hear from a guest speaker as well as a Carer Week Luncheon.

care finder - FREE SUPPORT SERVICE for Older - Vulnerable Community Members

What is care finder?

The care finder service is part of the Australian Government's response to the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety.

Care finders support vulnerable, older members of our community who currently find it difficult to access services and who do not have an existing support network (*family or friends*) to help them.

Care finder services are **free of charge** for **eligible** members of the community.

Who can use the care finder service?

The care finder service exists to support vulnerable older people who need intensive support to access My Aged Care and other aged care services and/or any other relevant supports in the community.

To receive care finder support, a person must:

- Need help with one or more everyday tasks
- Be 65 years or older (50 years for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people) OR
- Be a prematurely aged person aged 50 years or older (45 years for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people) – this is often the case for people who are low income earners and/or experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
- Have one or more reasons for requiring intensive support to navigate and access services.

How does the care finder service work?

1. If someone requires care finder support, a local organisation can connect them with a dedicated care finder or they can make contact with the care finder service directly.
2. A care finder will meet with them, usually in person. This can be at their home or another place they would like to meet, wherever the person will feel most comfortable.
3. The care finder will ask questions to understand the person's situation and support them to work through the steps to address their individual needs.

What help can care finders provide?

The care finder service can help vulnerable older people navigate the aged care system and find support services to improve their quality of life. Your local care finder service can help with both accessing services for the first time and changing or finding new services and supports.

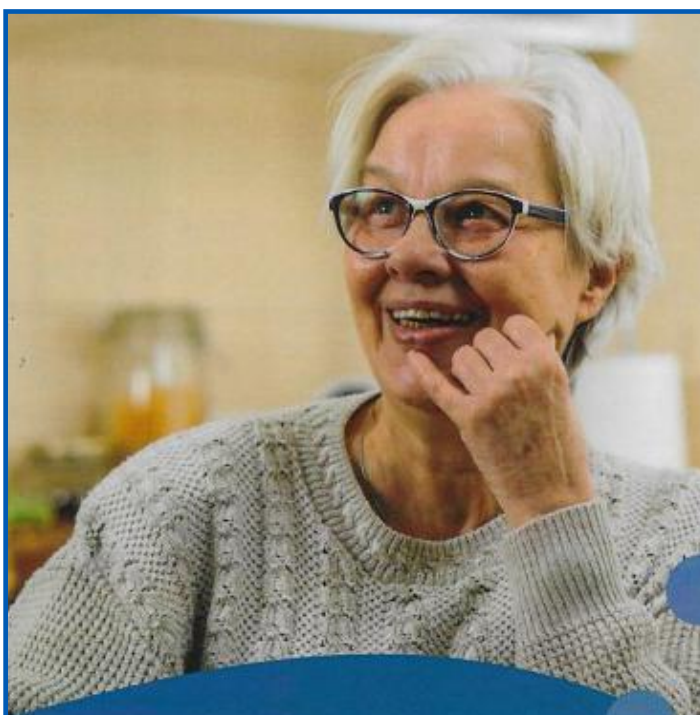
How can I access the care finder service?

A professional referral is **not required** to access care finder services. People requiring support can call their local care finder organisation directly or have someone call on their behalf.

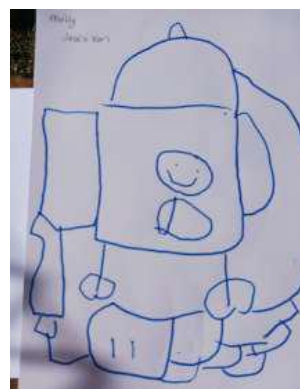

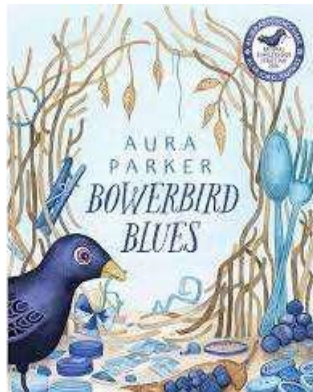

• PIONEER MUSEUM •

Preparation for the launch of our Fund-raising campaign has progressed with the engagement of a consultant to assist us in determining how to go about this process. We need to raise **\$1 million dollars** to establish the new building that will house the Jindera Cottage Crafts, an educational and interpretive centre, exhibition space and undercover area. This will all provide us with additional capacity to head into the future with greater confidence for the longevity of the museum.

We have been spending time looking at installing sound into sections of the museum that will help enhance the experience in those areas. We are also looking into the addition of figures into areas, to give those areas another connection to their past. Our men's group, and particularly John, have been working diligently in the past few weeks, to redo the straw on the roof of the hay shed. This was re-done pre-Covid but unfortunately it was found this wasn't rain proof, so work has been undertaken to hopefully improve the capability of the shed and protect those items stored within.

We also hope to erect a new sign at the front of the museum and are working towards having the front veranda roof replaced and the signage 'Wagners Store' redone. This all takes a considerable degree of coordination of trades and expertise, so far, we have been trying to get this done for over 18 months, so we are hoping this time, we may be able to get it sorted. We were hoping before the rain but!

The first weekend in **August** we are intending to hold the villages first **Lantern Festival – 'Laternlauf'** (see page 19 opposite) a German tradition based on the story of St Martin, also known as Martin the Merciful. Legend has it that Martin, faced with a shivering beggar clothed in rags during a harsh winter, used his sword to cut his soldiers cape in half, giving the beggar one half and keeping the other half for himself. Martin later became the Bishop of Tours and the patron of children and the poor. The festival therefore has children, and parents and carers, parade through the streets with their hand-made lanterns, culminating in a re-enactment of the story of St. Martin in the sound shell at the Village Green. The festival event is centred around kindness, light and fostering the community spirit. We will encourage our three schools to hold lantern making workshops for the children and to encourage them to learn some of the songs introduced for the festival walk and to participate in the festival to be held on **Saturday evening 3rd August**. The museum will also hold two **lantern making workshops** prior to the festival.

In conjunction with this, the museum is intending to hold a sound and light show over the three nights of this same weekend – **Illuminate Our Heritage** - the Museum will come alive after dark with a fabulous **light and sound display**. The historic buildings and grounds will be featured with lights and illuminated to bring the spaces in the museum alive with stories and entertainment. German-themed food and drinks will be available as well as entertainment by musicians and storytellers within the lovely museum grounds. An event to dispel the chills of winter and fill your evening with fun and delight.

The last weekend in May the museum held its **Campfire** event with a great bonfire, fire tubs, a three course meal and marshmallows. Although the night was cold, the wonderful music presented by the Swag and Billy bush band had peoples' toes tapping and many lined up for a few rounds of square dancing. There was much movement to the fires between courses, which featured Rodger's fabulous smoked brisket, Brian's herbed legs of lamb and our wonderful lady chefs' chicken camp-oven cook up. It was heralded as a great night and it was lovely to see the crowd embrace the evening, despite the cold (see photos page 19 opposite).

We have enjoyed a number of groups visiting the museum this month, including **St. John's kindergarten class**. It is always a delight to have these young folk often experience a place of history for the first time. They have most interesting insights into the objects on display and questions about what they see.

You will find our proposed **Program of Events** for the remainder of the year presented in this months Jindera News (see page 23). During this month the museum will host a **Vine twining workshop (or Wicker Workshop)**. This will be held off site at the old **Jindera Police House at 79 Urana St**, there are 2 sessions with very limited numbers, so if you are interested, please book at <https://www.trybooking.com/CSCGA>. Make your own wreath base or basket with freshly pruned vine. Refreshments will also be served (see page 19).

This is an early call-out for our **Forgotten Trades Fair** which we hold every second year; this will be held on **Sunday 23rd February 2025**. Participants with interesting trades or skills from yesteryear are encouraged to contact us to register your interest and participation.

As always, we **thank** our wonderful group of **volunteers** that give of their time and energy to help the museum in so many varied ways in its endeavours to remain a valuable tourist and local attraction.

For those of you who have not been to our Museum, come down and see us sometime. For those that have, we would be happy to have you **volunteer** if you have a few hours to spare and want to put something back into your community.

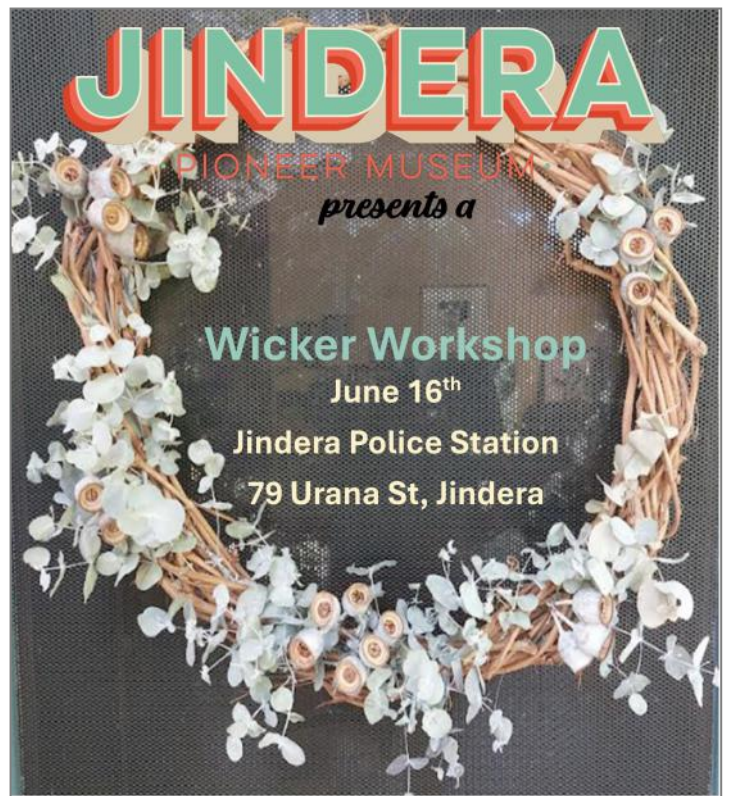

Jindera CWA News

June 2024

Over 700 CWA members, including 11 from Murray Group attended the NSW-CWA Conference at Coffs Harbour over 4 days in May. The Conference was opened by Governor of NSW her Excellency the Hon. Margaret Beazley AC KC.

CWA delegates endorsed more than 25 motions across sectors such as health, law and order, education, transport and the environment.

The motion of urgency on the need for more action on rates of domestic and family violence was the first item of business considered and was passed unanimously. The motion includes a call for an amendment to the NSW Bail Act to change the presumption of bail provisions to a default against bail for domestic and family violence offences.

Jindera's Motion – The provision of adequate funding for licensed teachers to provide swimming and water safety skill lessons to primary school students – was endorsed.

Health remained a big focus for branches. With numerous motions endorsed by delegates that seek to improve access to services for regional, rural and remote residents.

These motions will now be taken forward and form the basis of CWA of NSW lobbying efforts in the immediate future.

PANCREATIC CANCER was voted the HEALTH RESEARCH FUND ANNUAL PROJECT FOR 2024/25. A cheque for \$52,087 was presented to the University of Newcastle research into OVARIAN CANCER which was 2023/24 fund project.

Next Year State Conference will be held in Wagga Wagga.

Jindera members have had a busy time catering for a funeral, birthdays and Mother's Day cake stall at Bunnings.

Church Service for Murray Group was celebrated at St. John's Anglican Church Corowa, on 26th May. Rev. June Trigg and Rev. Jenni Bedding from Berrigan CWA officiated at service.

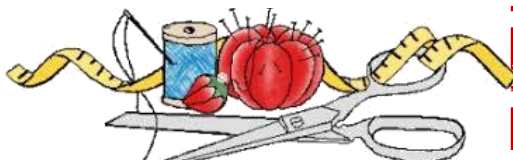

Our President Warren Berkerey opened the meeting and the National anthem was sung. 44 members were present and visitors were welcomed.

Robyn Lane was officially made a new member with a badge presentation.

Big news is that the **Beanie Competition** has reached 600 beanies and still rising. Big reveal is **6-7.30pm on 4th June.** Rsvp is necessary to take part.

Our five minute speaker was Beris Klemke. Beris married Lester. She has six children, 25 grandchildren and is soon to be a Great Nana. She has been involved in her church and youth groups, has been a sheep farmer's wife and she told us lots of lovely farming stories. Warren presented Beris with our Probus pen and we thank her for giving us all a smile with a small share in her life.

After morning tea Gary Kenney introduced us to his friend of 40 years, Dr. Penny Vine. Dr Vine belongs to **Murray Valley Refugee Group** who have a Facebook page of that name. Dr. Vine has been working with refugees as well as Aboriginal displacement and has been involved with the tragedy after five young people died at Gerogery.

Dr. Vine has worked with parents after sudden deaths of babies and understands the trauma of mastectomy.

Refugees are people who have been registered and are unable to return to their country out of well founded fear of being killed or imprisoned.

These people are hoping that life could be better. We heard of water being available in displaced persons camps for 2 hours, possibly and only 2 containers for water allowed.

We heard of people eventually being able to come to Australia with 202 Humanitarian Visas and the sponsored people having to repay air fare loans as they settle in. The funds are recycled to bring more people.

These traumatised people, most often non English speaking, with few belongings, are required to do 500 hours of English lessons, to fill out Centrelink paperwork for New-Start allowance and are required to look for work.

They need kind people to help.

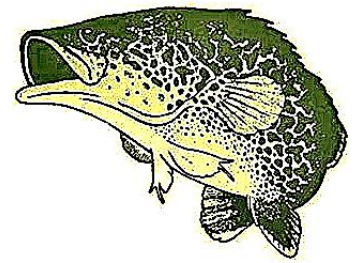

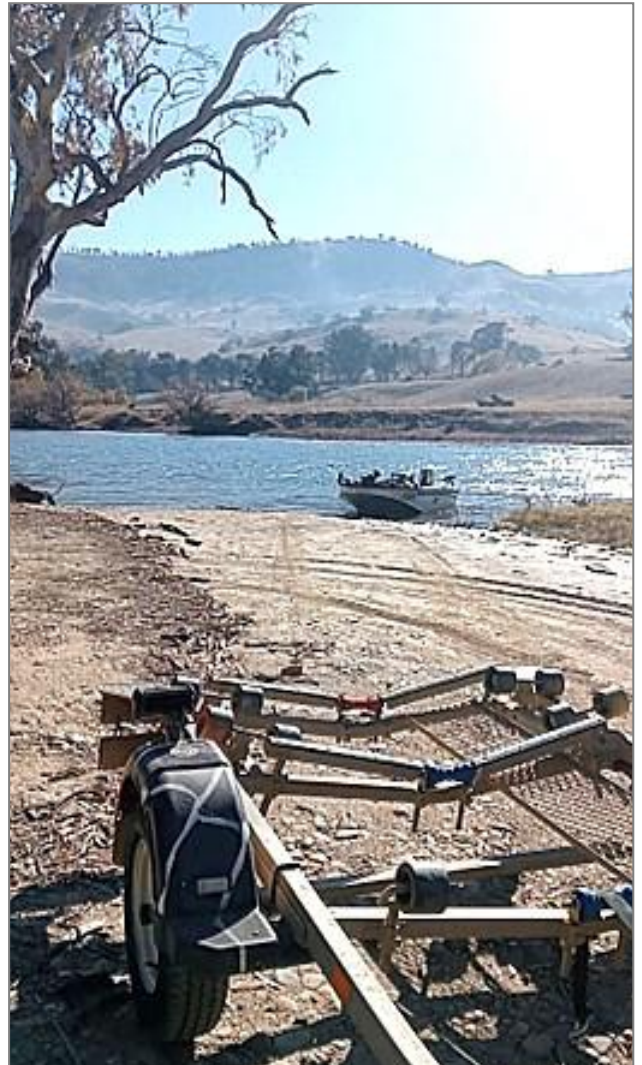

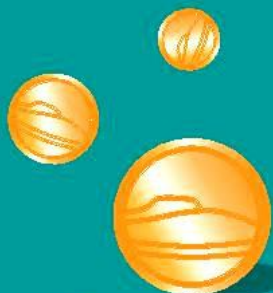
