Jindera unites to commemorate ANZAC Day - 2024



The Jindera ANZAC Day Dawn Service was well attended by an estimated 250 plus people.

This local dawn service originated in 2013 when Jindera resident Joe Kipper with assistance from Greg Finster organised a Dawn Service. This first service was attended by an estimated 50 people with them all going their own way after the service.



Then in 2014, on a suggestion from Denise Osborne, the **Fire Brigade** got involved and provided a coin donation, "Gunfire" breakfast, following the dawn service.

In 2015 Greg took on the organising role with Robert Anderson helping with the sound system. And now in its eleventh year Greg has handed over the organising role to a local veteran, Mick Smitto.

It is great that there are local people willing to take on this role and continue the tradition.



So from humble beginnings it is extremely gratifying to see the increasing number of families and young people, willing to brave the predawn elements and attend our dawn service. We hope this trend continues and that the ANZAC spirit is not forgotten.



The concept of the Jindera Dawn Service was designed to be a simple ceremony that commemorates and allows a time of reflection to honour those who have fallen in battle.

Headlines and Happenings

Constitution

The RCL committee have been working behind the scenes over the last 12 months on updating our Constitution. This has involved:

- Investigating irregularities which were discovered with the RCL constitution prior to last year's AGM.
- Researching RCL's requirement to incorporate up to date information according to the relevant Act and governance standards of the Australian Charities and Not for Profit Commission (ACNC) and NSW Government Fair Trading.
- Holding a Strategic planning day with members to highlighted current RCL core business and how this related to the current constitution.
- Sourcing Legal Support via pro bono lawyer support through Justice Connect.

This has resulted in updated constitution incorporating 'Model Rules' as set out by NSW Government Fair Trading and incorporating Rural Care Links legal requirements as a Not-for-profit charity operating a 'Public Fund for persons in necessitous circumstances'.

The update will now include the following 'Aims and Objects' as follows:

The aims and objects of the association are to provide charitable services beneficial to the community (Objects)

To promote the Objects, the association may for example conduct activities including one or more of:

- (a) operation of an Opportunity Shop selling clothing and other items.
- (b) Publishing a community newspaper promoting the activities of community groups and organisations.
- (c) Provision of support of a charitable nature to those in necessitous circumstances.
- (d) The operation of a public fund for the relief of persons in necessitous circumstances.
- (e) Other services and activities of a charitable nature beneficial to the community as the Committee shall determine from time to time.

The term 'necessitous circumstances' to describe people requiring support has been a long-standing issue for the Rural Care Link. Unfortunately, it is a legal requirement that this term is used in our Constitution. However, on the ground we are working on a suitable replacement name and have had some great suggestions/ideas from our members.

The Op Shop also holds several antique and unusual items which are worth a look, you never know what treasure you might find.



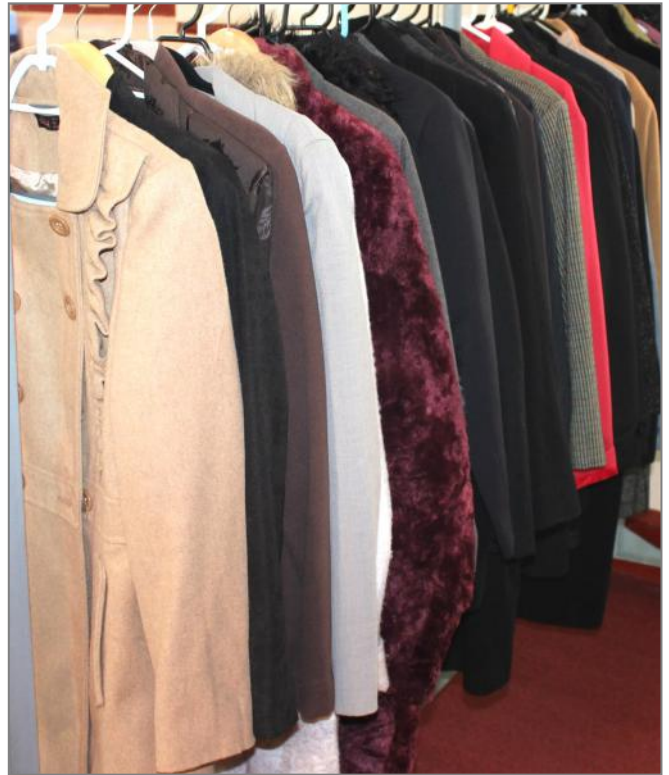

Fergus Hamilton - our local link to the Paris Olympics



Jindera local, Fergus Hamilton, has been selected to compete at the 2024 Paris Olympics in the Rowing Team in the Coxless Men's 4 (M4-).



Fergus and his family have lived in Jindera since 2014 when they moved here for work and Fergus has always been proud to call Jindera home even though he was often away at boarding school in Melbourne. He rows for Victoria and during his school holidays would train and compete for Corowa Rowing Club.

As part of a single parent family, Fergus aged 24 is the oldest of three, Tierney his sister is 22 and Rory is 19. Fergus was born in England and then spent some years in NZ before moving to Australia in 2011 becoming an Australian Citizen in 2021.

He was a reserve for the Tokyo Olympic Games rowing team and he always says he was *'born in England, programmed in NZ and tested in Australia'*!

Fergus has always been a natural athlete and played rugby, hockey, AFL, water-polo, swimming and loves all water sports. However the sport he most wanted to excel in has always been rowing, as there is a long tradition of rowing on both sides of the family. At 200cm or 6'7 he is definitely built for it.

Fergus first learnt to row in 2012 on a farm dam, he then progressed to the rowing program at Gippsland Grammar which started in Year 7 and he competed until he won a scholarship to Melbourne Grammar to board and row from Year 9.

At school he won the prestigious 2016 APS Head of the River in Year 11 and the crew travelled to Henley Royal Regatta in England to compete in the Princess Elizabeth Cup. One of his crew mates from this crew, Jack Robertson is also in the M4-competing with him this year in Paris.



During his final year at school he was selected to represent Australia at the 2017 Junior World Rowing Championships in Lithuania with Cormac Kennedy-Leverett from Queensland - they won Gold and came away as Junior World Champions.

As a successful junior rower Fergus was pursued by many US Collegiate rowing teams and offered places to study in the US - the process included hosting coaches from Yale, Harvard, Washington and Princeton for dinner here in Jindera. Fergus chose Yale University and studied there from August 2018 to May 2023, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology. The Yale rowing program is one of the top university rowing programs in the USA and he travelled around the US for training camps and races with a lot of

success. On all the Yale press releases and event programs Fergus is always listed as coming from Jindera, Australia!

Covid interrupted a year of racing in the US and some international opportunities which meant he only got to compete at one Championship. 2023 was his last year at Yale, then due to an athlete retiring he got a late call up to join the Australian Rowing Team. Fergus is now based full time in Canberra with the Australian Men's Rowing team where he trains 3 times a day 6 days a week.

He will be leaving Australia in May to train at the Australian National Training Centre in Italy and will compete at events in Switzerland and Poland before the rowing starts at the **Olympics on 28th July**.

Obviously his Mum here in Jindera is very biased but says Fergus is an absolutely lovely person and has always been recognised for being very humble, dedicated and lots of fun. He has sacrificed so much for his rowing as he started boarding school before his 14th birthday and attended rowing camps during holidays.

Fergus only got to come home for a few weeks in summer and at Christmas. Apart from his sport he is very happy out in the middle of nowhere on a fishing/hunting trip or maybe at home having a few beers and beating us all at Monopoly!

AROUND THE TOWN

UPDATE

- For those observant people you may have noticed a lot of clearing happening in two places in Jindera. The first being on the edge of the Jindera Industrial estate and the second at Drumwood Road between the road and fence-line. Both areas have been cleared of heavy undergrowth and the rubbish which has been dumped there. The work will now allow council to keep the areas mown. Along Drumwood Rd the clearing will give a safe area to walk or ride bikes. Planning for a future permanent path will now be able to be undertaken.
- Quotes & plans have been received for shade sails in the new playground. The quote is in four separate parts. Keep your eyes open for fundraising efforts to help reach the amount needed. Council have included funds in the 2023-2024 budget but not enough to cover all the cost.
- Council is supporting the application for a school crossing supervisor at the Urana Rd-St Mary McKillop College crossing by the college.
- A ramp to the zipline at the adventure playground will be installed.
- The upgrade (reconstruction and sealing of the 1.8km of gravel) of Jelbart Rd is planned in 2 stages, one in the 24/25 financial year and then Stage 2 in 25/26 at a cost of \$750k per year.
- Members of the community have expressed concerns about the potential fire risk posed by the Jinder travelling stock reserves (TSR) and after consultation with the local land service TSR ranger that a hr. burn would take place, recently fire mitigation works have been undertaken by the Jindera Rural Fire Service (RFS) and the burn will go ahead in the near future as determined by the RFS.
- Works will be carried out on Lindner Rd and the intersection of Walla Rd in association with the Glenellen Solar Farm project. Please be cautious when driving in that area.

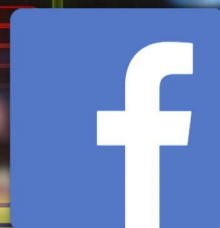

Little Saints Office Display

Self-portraits are a way for artists to show more than just their looks. Drawing their own faces can be tricky for kids because they often want to draw their whole bodies. But even in their simple drawings, children reveal a lot about how they see themselves. They learn to talk about their features and colours as they draw, developing essential skills. Our children have had the opportunity to explore this concept and create a beautiful display of belonging and agency within the Learning community of St John's Lutheran School and Little Saints Preschool.



Outdoor Larger Loose Parts Play

Outside, down the very back of our big yard, is the most magnificent 'secluded' area. It is under the big tree, near the sandpit and the hose. We have observed the children claim this space as their 'fire'. There is so much collaboration and problem solving happening here- with much discussion about the resources available such as big reels, planks of timber, branches off trees and big rocks. This interdependence as learners fosters relationships and teamwork. They draw upon their own and others imagination in this space where there is a 'fire' camping chairs and a cooking space - recalling knowledge they have from their own lives to scaffold their play.



Board Games

Playing simple board games encourages a range of executive functioning skills. When children have opportunities to develop executive function and self-regulation skills, research shows lifelong benefits. These skills are very important for learning and development. They support positive behaviour and choices for ourselves and others.

These skills include-

- * Working memory (this governs our ability to retain and manipulate pieces of information over short periods of time- e.g. the roll of the red dice means I put a red token on).
- * Mental flexibility (This helps us to sustain or change our attention in response to different demands e.g.- such as in a game of chance being ok when things don't go the way we wanted).
- * Self-control (which enables us to prioritise and resist impulsive actions e.g.- not wanting to have a turn when its not your go or being ok if someone else wins)



Physical Play

Well done to those who competed in the 2024 St John's Cross Country.

We saw lots of Little Saints participate in this big race and give it their best go! You are all amazing. Thank you to those who helped encourage our friends to have a go.

Obstacle courses for kids offer a great way to exercise while engaging various muscle groups. By navigating through these courses, children work on their legs, arms, and core muscles, developing overall strength across their entire body.

Obstacle courses for kids also aid in improving motor skills, coordination, and balance.

Navigating these courses requires children to utilise various skills, which can vary depending on their age, fostering their overall physical development.

A hidden advantage of obstacle courses for kids is their ability to stimulate problem-solving skills. Children must assess each piece of equipment and devise strategies to overcome obstacles, engaging their minds in problem-solving. With repeated play, they may even rely on memory to recall successful approaches from the past. Thus, obstacle courses provide physical exercise and strengthen various cognitive skills.

Another valuable aspect of obstacle courses for kids is their capacity to promote teamwork and communication.

Although children can navigate the equipment individually, these courses often draw multiple kids to play together.

Children collaborate to conquer different obstacles through interaction, conversation, and mutual encouragement.

This interaction necessitates the development of communication skills as they guide and support each other through the course.

Rural Care Link (RCL) have put on the 25th Jindera Garage Sale and it was a cracker of a day. The autumn weather was superb which drew the people from the surrounding Albury/Wodonga and Greater Hume areas as well as from afar.

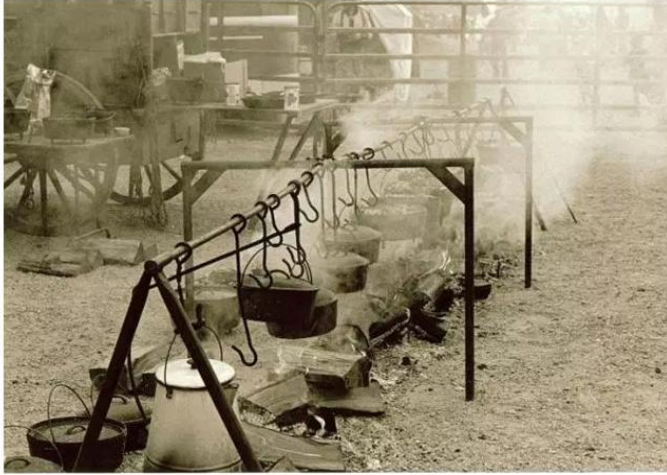

ANZAC Day - 2024

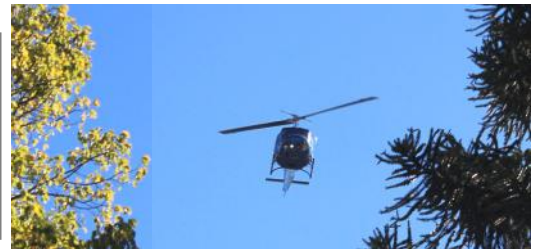
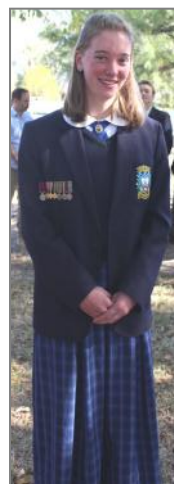

JINDERA RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

HAZARD REDUCTION

Due to favourable weather conditions over the coming weeks, fire agencies and land managers will be conducting a number of critical hazard reduction burns across the state. Smoke from these burns may settle across the local area so please remember that smoke from bush fires and hazard reduction burning can affect some people more than others. NSW Health reminds people that children, older adults and people with heart and lung conditions are most susceptible to the effects of air pollution and excessive smoke.

If you have asthma or a lung condition, reduce outdoor activities if smoke levels are high and if shortness of breath or coughing develops, take your reliever medicine or seek medical advice.

Asthma sufferers need to follow their Asthma Action Plan and take their relieving medication where necessary.

If symptoms get worse, asthma sufferers need to seek medical advice. Further advice is available from the [Asthma Foundation website](#).

Here are some tips to stay safe during hazard reduction burning.

Monitor the [NSW RFS hazard reduction page](#) for information about planned burns and smoke advisories in your area.

- Keep doors and windows closed to prevent smoke from entering your home.
- Remove washing from clotheslines.
- Ensure pets have a protected area.
- If you're driving through a smoky area, slow down, keep your windows up and turn your headlights on.
- **Don't call Triple Zero just to report that "it's smoky". Save Triple Zero for emergencies.**

Change of Season

Autumn is here! One of the most beautiful times of the year, as the garden takes a reprieve from the heat of summer and displays some of its most beautiful colours, before a time of rest over winter. Autumn in the garden is a great, the cooler days make working in the garden easier and moisture is retained without the heat of summer so a little water goes further.

Autumn garden task and ideas

- ⊗ Planting Vegetables – broccoli, leek, rhubarb, carrot, parsnip, peas, beetroot.
- ⊗ Planting Flowers – Calendula (marigold), pansies, poppies
- ⊗ Garden jobs – Divide evergreen perennials (plant or pot to give away)
- ⊗ Begin pruning back /de heading as plants reach the end of their flowering season and head into dormancy over winter.
- ⊗ Collect and compost fallen leaves.
- ⊗ Mulch to protect roots of plants from the wintry weather, it also improves soil structure and helps retain moisture from winter rainfall for the warmer months that will come again.
- ⊗ Monitor snail and slug populations.
Try a natural solution like a beer trap (safer for pets)

Beer Trap (for snails & slugs)

Bury a container around the area where you want to trap the snails, leaving the rim out of the soil. You can also cut the top off of a plastic bottle, invert it, and stick it back n the bottle to make a funnel trap. The snails will be attracted to the fermented yeast in the beer, go for a sip, fall in and drown.
