Dot and Ennis moved into the Jindera village on 19 November, 1994. Sadly Ennis passed away in 2015, the couple had been married for 60 years.


Dot was among the original participants of Jindera's Community Garage Sale in



As the Museum progressed, Dot moved to being involved in the catering side with her scones being a specialty and a favourite of the Museum diners. These days Dot



enjoys buying her scones when she visits the Museum Tearooms and loves volunteering on the Museums Lost Trades Day event showing how butter was once made and is known as the 'Butter Lady'.







When Dot moved into town, she wanted a house in the middle of Jindera so that they could walk to church and the shops. Although today, Dot still has a restricted licence for her car, she generally relies on her motorised scooter to get around to the shops and the neighbourhood. She jokingly suggested that if a bike-walking track was established between Jindera and Lavington then perhaps she could use it on her scooter.

Dot keeps herself busy making fire lighters of different sizes from shredding paper and is currently

experimenting with making paper bricks for family and friends with lots of them supplying her with paper to recycle. She also makes a great Worcestershire sauce. Dot says she saw the recipe in the Weekly Times and thought it sounded easy to make so she now makes the sauce to give to loved ones.



Dot will turn 90 years young on October 6th.







A Cracking good time

Some of the children have been looking at the river stones around the yard. Some children had noticed that they had cracked and broken. This led to a small group project with Miss Amy where they were exploring how this may have occurred. The children used a larger rock and found ways to use it to create a crack or force the rock apart. This is a Physics concept. Looking at how stress creates cracks and changes the shape of something. Great for confidence building when cracking rocks, and great for building vocabulary such as force and strength. This learning as a small group allows for the children to have their thoughts and ideas heard. They can offer perspective and learn from their peers.





Buddies

Our Big Saints Program has prompted the opening of our Buddies program. Engaging with our St Johns year 5 students is a wonderful way to learn ways to interact with older peers in the school environment. We talked about playing games together and what skills these games bring such as turn-taking, following rules and early counting.

We finished the session with a large group game of "Round the World". We reminded the bigger children that they were playing against 4 and 5-year-olds but boy did our Little Saints play competitively!! They know their shapes and although the trick of this game is to be able to recall the name of the shape quickly, they blitzed it!! We will be doing more with the buddies over the remainder of the year.

Sensory play

We added some shaving cream to the tough tray with the wedgits. This was to follow on from some sensory play with mud in the sandpit and to also extend the play with the wedgits to form some style of 'mortar' for their play. This engaged a small group of children with them offering what they think the shaving cream feels like- "its squishy" "It's so soft" "It's like gloves" "It feels so warm" "it's so soft" "It feels so warm" "it's so soft" "I need more to feel it".






Little Saints on Country

Why are we Excited About DAYLIGHT SAVINGS? What does it mean to a Gardener?

Spending more time in our garden with the longer hours approaching is very exciting for a keen Gardener, who loves to plan ahead.

Timing is of the utmost importance especially for a vegetable garden. There is a good variety of seeds or

seedlings you would like to plant but be careful you don't plant too early; the soil has to be warm.

Covering up your vegetables is another option you may want to choose but don't forget to *Cover Up*.

Family gatherings are very important especially with barbecues and birthdays. These will get you motivated to use your crafty skills and decorate with colour including party lights.

STRAW BALES

Straw bales save time for a quick easy garden when timing is an issue. Straw is great for **Potatoes** just throw ... Weeds, Manure and Lawn clippings on top of the potatoes with a sprinkle of fire ashes and fertiliser.



Keep adding straw to the potatoes leaves as they appear this will give you more potatoes as you cover them.

If you want to add other vegetables to your straw garden pile soil high then add soil between straw before planting.



When vegetables are finished you will have good soil left to add somewhere to improve your garden.





Remember, no burning on days of a Total Fire Ban.

As we approach our Bushfire Danger period we ask that you check the NSW RFS website NSW RFS - NSW Rural Fire Service to update (or to start) your Bushfire Survival plan and to make sure you are familiar with the fire danger rating sign that you will see coming back on our electronic notice boards soon. The NSW RFS website has some great resources to help you understand what the fire danger ratings mean for you.

GETTING READY FOR BUSH FIRE IS EASIER THAN YOU THINK

THE 4 SIMPLE STEPS ARE:









1. DISCUSS

2. PREPARE

3. KNOW

There are also some great fact sheets on the NSW RFS website providing advice on how to prepare yourself and your property to be Bushfire ready. This link will help you be prepared for the season- BFSP-Complete.pdf (nsw.gov.au) If you have not download the Hazards **Near Me** app already we would encourage you to do this and setup a watch zone around Jindera to make sure you are alerted of any bushfire, flood and sever weather events in the area.
