Mt. Maze back home to **ROCK** Jindera!

Last time we caught up with local talented brothers Adam and Nathan Tollis and Mt. Maze band was just over a year ago and they're now home for Jindera's Battle of the Bands. Since then there has been a few changes to the dynamic and how Mt. Maze works, with two new members Jacob Elliott



aka Claz on bass and young gun Riley King on lead guitar. Mt Maze made the call late last year to try their hand in tracking new music themselves at home with all their own gear,

first song being *Creatures* the title track off their EP, which was recorded in their previous jam spot, an old church in Wodonga. They were lucky enough to have local music legend

Jared Buckley temporarily fill in on bass and jump on board to record this track. It was around this time that good friend Claz came in full time as the new bass player, bringing a fresh and exciting energy to the band. 'Honestly' Adam tells us, 'our biggest hype man'.

Nick Musarra (rhythm guitar) had been working hard to organize the band's first headline tour to promote the release of the Creatures EP. With the release date and tour fast approaching the band needed a new lead guitarist. So they invited a couple of local lads for a jam to see who would gel with them and fit into the direction of sound they

wanted to head towards. Whilst jamming out a potential new song Riley shined with amazing harmonics which led to form one of the quickest songs they have written as a group.

The band was complete.

The EP had been released and 2 days later they were playing their first show of the tour at one

of their favorite venues, La La La's in Wollongong, it absolutely poured with rain but they still had a great turn out. From there Mt Maze went north through torrential rain to Newcastle, this show was

unfortunately not a great turn out. They were told by a support band, Butterknife, this was due to the venue, telling the band that they should come back and play at a popular venue with them.

Next up was a really cool little venue in Sydney called the Petersham Bowls Club, a small room down stars with a stage. It was definitely the highlight of the tour. This gig was just a couple of tickets shy of selling out and had some excellent support acts, one being their now good mates, Help Street. The show went off and they had the best time. With some sore heads it was

off to the last show of the tour at Canberra Uni. This gave them the chance to be reunited with friends and family who went up to Canberra to support the boys. Off to the left of the Uni stage was a huge black wall signed by so many big names in the Aussie music scene. Adam tells Jindera News 'it was an awesome feeling to perform on the same stage as these amazing acts'.

Since then they've been recording and writing some new songs which you will be able to hear at up coming local gigs. Mt Maze is very excited to be asked to play at the Jindera Battle of the Bands, saying 'it's great to see a push for local music in our community'. The band know it's not an easy or cheap thing for original musicians,


> that's why they sell merch at all shows they are involved in to dampen their costs. Travel and releasing music can be very

and support our local Mt Maze guys, buy some merch and rock on with the band in Jindera on Sunday 6th October at the Battle of the Bands.



Superannuation for Unpaid Carers: The next logical step.



Carers must be supported to achieve greater economic wellbeing just like parents, according to the national peak body representing unpaid carers. Carers Australia is calling on Federal Government to improve the wellbeing and economic support for Australia's 2.65 million unpaid carers by adding superannuation to the Carer Payment. It comes after Finance Minister Katy Gallagher confirmed the government plans to introduce legislation ensuring super on government-funded paid parental leave.

While Carers Australia fully supports the move, and applauds the government for its investment, it wants to ensure those whose working lives are interrupted to provide unpaid care, are not left behind.

Data analysis shows a primary carer loses an average of \$175,000 in superannuation and \$392,500 in lifetime earnings, to the age of 67. Some who are carers for extended periods of time will lose substantially more, with the most affected 10% losing at least \$940,000 in lifetime income, and \$444,500 in retirement savings.

As of September 2023, there were 304,480 Australians in

receipt of Carer Payment, and the average length of time receiving this was 11.5 years2 – significantly longer than the average length of time taking paid parental leave.

Providing unpaid care can impact an individual's employment outcomes, and over time affect the superannuation and retirement savings. Paying superannuation on the Carer Payment would not only contribute to a carer's financial security in retirement but also reduce the demand for future government expenditure on the Age Pension.

Lucy Tatchell, Carers Australia acting CEO, said: "If these changes were implemented by the current Government, we would begin to see real-life benefits for a community in Australia providing at least \$80 billion worth of care services for free to those who need it most. "Economically, people who provide unpaid care are likely to earn less than those who do not. It is time we did more for the cohort of carers who have had to give up employment opportunities to provide care and reduce their superannuation deficit."



Hume and Hovell Bicentenary charity walk up Table Top Mountain

On 17th October 1824, Hamilton Hume and William Hovell, with 6 other men, left the Lake George District near Yass to explore the countryside between there and Port Phillip Bay. On Saturday 13th November of that year, they camped at the northeastern foot of a mountain, known as Mulyan yar Gunyah to the local Wiradjiri tribe, meaning 'home of the eagle'.

Hume and Hovell named this mountain Battery Mount. From where they were camped, it resembled a fortified gun battery because of its sheer cliffs and square corners. The name "Battery Mount" fell into disuse in the 1850's.

People had started calling it Table Top Mountain because of its distinctive skyline and the fact that it was part of Table Top Station, then owned by Elizabeth Mitchell.

Sundays were rest days for the explorers, so instead of continuing their southward trek, Hume and Hovell used Sunday the 14th November to climb the mountain for a better view of the surrounding countryside. William Hovell wrote a detailed description of his observations from the mountain top in his expedition journal.



To commemorate the bicentenary of Hume and Hovell's climb of Table Top Mountain, Albury North Rotary Club is organising a charity walk up the mountain on Sunday 17th November to raise funds for the Albury Wodonga Cancer Centre.

As part of the commemoration, a cairn will be erected on the summit. Participants will be able to participate in its construction by placing a stone in the wire mesh frame of the cairn. (see advert above).




PROBUS Monthly News - by Helen Squires

The museum will also launch the new website this week which will have a strong focus on the partnership program available for people and organisations to donate to the new development at the museum. This is a big endeavour for the committee and membership and we hope the community will get behind us to support this new

development which will allow the museum to cater for more people and COTTAGE more programs. It will also see the CRAFT Jindera Cottage Crafts move into



new premises and make their crafts available whenever the museum is open, not just a few hours a week. It is an exciting time for the museum but one that needs faith and support for it to be achievable.

We have been very fortunate to have Sancon Civil P/L, our local earth-moving and civil engineering



company, prepare the site for our new machinery shed, which we are hoping to have erected prior to Christmas. Sancon have graciously supported the museum, preparing the site at no cost, which we are extremely grateful for. The shed is due to arrive this month. The new shed will house several pieces of machinery that at present reside outdoors, which is detrimental to their well-being. This is particularly the case for the chaff-cutter from Granite Hill.

This chaff cutter, in its days of operation, was



transported around the district, cutting chaff for many farms. Chaff is cut from the straw left over after removing the heads of the crop for the grain. The stalks are cut into small lengths and often mixed with other products,

such as molasses, to make it a more palatable fodder for sheep, cattle and horses. This chaff cutter was utilised extensively in the district with several men travelling with it to operate the process. It has been a great acquisition for the museum given its history in the district.

We hope you can visit us at the museum or join us at one of the events this month.

The breakfast club program not only ensures that students have a healthy meal but also fosters a sense of community and belonging within the school.








Education Week

All Electors will be asked to answer "yes" or "no" to the following questions:


Currently Greater Hume is divided into **three wards** that **elect 9 Councillors** in total.

Do you favour:

- 1. Abolishing this ward system in favour of a single area consisting of all voters that elects 9 councillors?
- 2. Making no change to this system; That is three wards and 9 councillors remain?"

If the removal of wards is supported by a majority of formal votes cast at the 2024 election, the 2028 local government elections would be conducted as an **undivided area** (without wards).



The Power of Sand Play

Over the last 3 weeks we have watched some amazing engineering and design happening in the sandpit. The thought, cooperation, planning, resilience and persistence involved in making these channels and bridges in the sand pit is extraordinary. So much STEM (Science, Technology, Maths) is happening in this play. We continue to allow children to use water in the colder weather and to take an active role in making sure that they take time to warm up when they get cold or to get changed after they have finished playing if they get muddy.



Art

"Art should include the process of material inquiries, including the steps taken by children to understand, make sense of, and create meaning in their world. The way children interact and engage with objects, and the world around them is a large part of their artistic process". This is a quote by Nadia Latin in "Respecting children's art: Nurturing creativity and autonomy" Amplify, 2023. It has provoked change in how we see the provision of art at Little Saints and how greater access to art process' including the paints, clay, the tools to expand on ideas as well as the space to create. This led to our art space widening and easier access to the art media, usually stored away in a cupboard for Educators to decide on colours for the day. But what if we handed the decision to our learner? To the artist themselves. To make colours by experimenting with mixing. To combine media and using paint with the collage. But in this right to express themselves through art we also promote responsibility. To take care of our resources- to clean up spills and minimise

I feel a little like the baton has been handed to your child. That we value their thoughts and ideas and the right to choose. We are here to support. To guide. We look forward to seeing where this leads our future Picasso's. The Anh Do's and the Michael Angelo's.





Our Olympic Tally Project is Off and Running (no pun intended!)



The children have really enjoyed using skills such as research and technology to find out the numbers of medals countries have won. We have had some great discussion about sports they have been watching at home- from water polo, gymnastics, skateboarding, diving, swimming and BMX racing. The children's recall and description of these sports have been detailed and confident.

We have then been able to really observe the numeracy knowledge of our class- knowing the numerals, recognising the drawing of medals and counting them either out loud or instantly knowing the number by sight. We have been counting on when we add medals and looking at concepts of more /less/equal.

We have used this intentional teaching moment to identify numeracy concepts to the children. That they are "doing maths" when they are doing this. The EYLF tells us that experiences in early childhood settings build on the numeracy that children have within their families and communities. This positive attitude is a great foundation for lifelong numeracy learning. It all starts here!

It's funny how we can have these great teaching plans on where children can learn from the Olympics events and the children themselves steer the learning to other directions. After the children had followed up their own interests in making their own medals the conversation was extended to real medals and what they felt like. Miss Amy brought in some real medals and the children were able to feel how heavy they are and how the colours are different between them. Mrs Belinda shared with some of the group that she has held an Olympic medal from Dylan Alcott for his win in the Paralympics for wheelchair basketball. It was VERY heavy!





Little Saints on Country

Through the expansion of this program to 3 mornings a week we have noticed that the children are actively engaging and extending their play with the natural resources. The Educators are scaffolding their learning though using small group discussions on the environment and current interests to foster learning opportunities.

This has included making fairy homes with sticks against the trees a bit like the big school kids bases. They even added some grass on top of the roof! Other children rolled the mud into clay balls a bit like the clay in our art area. A few of the children were part of a hunt for gum nuts and sticks to add to the oral story telling of 'Wombat Stew' for the chewy insects part of the story. We will keep going to Little Saints on Country for a few more weeks.



With the warmer and very windy weather we have been experiencing our Captain Graham Yensch reminds everyone "there is potential for fires to spread fast under these conditions. Our Bushfire Danger Period is due to start on the 1st of November, but this may change depending on the weather over the next few months".

He also said, "that even though we are still outside of the bushfire danger period landowners still need to notify their neighbours, and the NSW RFS 24 hours prior of burning off".

We have had a few callouts to small fires in the Jindera Village and surrounds recently; notifying your neighbours and the NSW RFS that you are burning will be a great help to us to *prevent unnecessary call outs*.

If the NSW RFS knows about a fire before you light it, they do not always have to call us out. If you have any doubts about lighting a burn off, please check with the Brigade first or do not light the fire until the weather conditions will allow you to control the fire at all times.

With Spring now with us you may see the trucks out a bit more as we continue to **train and prepare** for the coming fire season. As you are preparing your garden again, please use your Green Bin (if you have one) to help reduce any potential fire fuel on your property.

Over the next few months, Jindera RFS will be providing more information on how to make your property fire safe this year. You may see the Brigades in the Albury area holding events for the NSW RFS **Get Ready Weekend** in September. They are great events to attend, and you can pick up great resources to help you prepare your **Bush Fire Survival Plan**. Remember we all live with bushfires, and we need to be ready for them this year.

The NSW RFS will be holding information sessions as we get closer to the Bushfire Danger Period.

Keep an eye on the **Jindera Fire Brigade display board** at the station as we get closer to the Bushfire Danger Period as you will soon see the fire danger rating for the day returning.

The Brigade is always on the look out for **new member's**, so if you see us at the Jindera fire station drop-in and have a chat to us. We have many roles that you can help us with if you do not want to get on a fire truck.

Upgrade work will soon begin on the nbn® Fixed Wireless network in Jindera to provide access to faster speeds and extended coverage.

The tower upgrades will mean some planned outages that may impact homes and businesses and their ability to use their nbn service while the work is underway. nbn is looking to minimise service interruptions as much as possible however there may be occasions when towers are taken offline for technicians to complete physical works, such as installing new hardware and replacing existing technology on the towers.

Telstra Tower Relocation Update

Farrer MP Sussan Ley joined with local GHC Councillor Jenny O'Neill and other community members at the Recreation Reserve on Monday 26 August, expressing concern with ongoing patchy and unreliable Telstra mobile phone coverage around Jindera.

Telstra has had approvals in place since January to install 4G/5G antennas on the existing Optus tower at the reserve, a move which would dramatically improve the telco's range and signal strength outside the town boundary.

Ms Ley says Telstra - which recorded a \$1.8b operating profit last year – informed her it did not have the budget to do the work, with a possibility the connection could now be pushed back to 2026!

"Telstra needs to get moving on this", Ms Ley said. "We have one of the border's fastest growth areas here in Jindera (increasing about 4% pa), with Greater Hume Council projecting the population could hit 8,000 by 2050."Right now, Telstra is really letting this community down, with Optus and NBN routinely delivering far better coverage.



Regional Manager Matt Connell attended the community meeting and outlined the company's free 7-Day Mobile Network Trial*, which allows anyone to keep their existing phone (accessing Telstra) but switch to the Optus signal when this was stronger. "Customers with a relatively modern phone can effortlessly enroll in the trial and switch between their current provider and Optus, allowing a direct comparison without any disruption to their existing service."

Meanwhile NBN says it plans to enhance and expand its Fixed Wireless footprint on their separate tower in Jindera by December this year.




